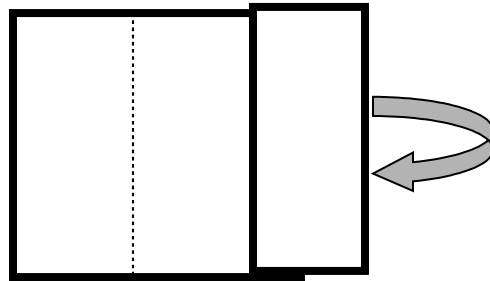


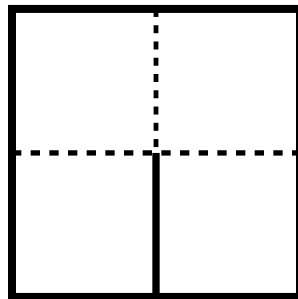
Shutter Book

This book will serve as a collection point for most unit activities. The best paper to use is 12 x 18 inch construction paper. The inside pieces are made from regular 8 ½ x 11 duplicating paper.

First, fold the construction paper in half, but don't crease it. Pinch the center. Then fold each edge to the center and crease. What you get will look suspiciously like a social studies fair backboard.



On the right side of the Shutter Book, you will glue the 8 Flap Book you made for Vocabulary. Glue the book so that the flaps open on the right like the pages of a book. Next, you will make two 2 Flap books by folding 2 sheets of duplicating paper together. Fold them horizontally (hamburger) first, then vertically (hotdog). This will divide your paper into fourths. Open both papers flat, and cut both sheets from the bottom edge, along the fold, to the center of the paper.



Fold each book separately so that the flaps open up on the inside. These books will be used for character descriptions as students learn more about each main one. These books are glued to the left flap of the Shutter Book with the folds toward the outside edge.

The center section of the book is where students will staple their notebook paper to be used as a Response Log for their reading. A Step Book may also be stapled here.
