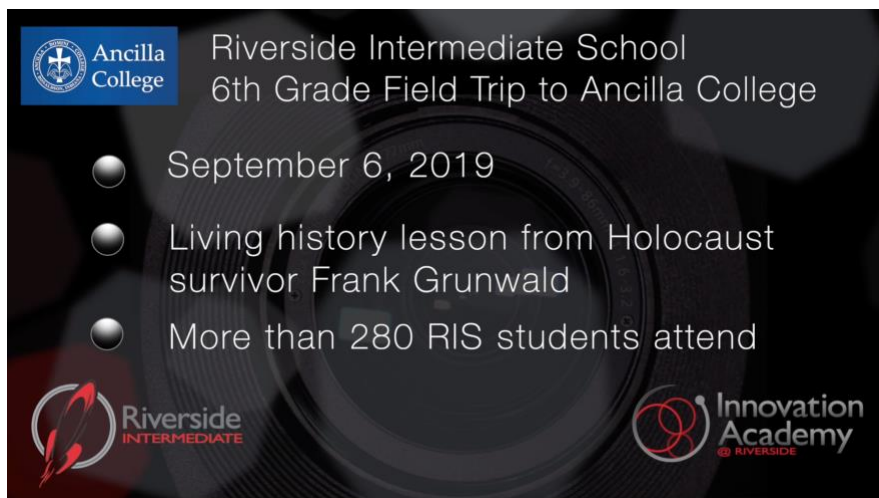
Golba: “I am happy and glad to spend my time and give back to the community.” 4

Gillard: “I think it's important to get outside of the walls so our students know, this is real knowledge this is first hand knowledge and were not just teaching something that doesn't apply to the rest of the world.”

Dicus: “The main purpose was so we could like kind of get into detail what happened in the Holocaust.” 10

Gillard: “It was a full day event on Friday, September 6th. 2

Dicus: “The whole team of 6th grade went to Ancilla and we got to see Mr. and Mrs. Grunwald.” 7

Gillard: “We watched a documentary that Mr.Grunwald was in and it’s the story of how he stayed alive because he could do music. He was able to survive in four different concentration camps, how he was liberated, and then what he’s done since. We got to have a question and answer time with him, just our students and it was awesome because our students gave great questions and he gave great answers back.” 23

Dicus: “I sat there with my phone like this, I videotaped it so my family could see.” 5

Gillard: “It’s a once and a lifetime opportunity, whenever you can have first hand accounts given to you- that’s the best way to learn, most of our students didn’t even know what a holocaust was, or where it happened, at the end of the year we will get into a holocaust unit so we will be able to circle back and use this information.” 16
