COVID-19 Statement

On March 16, 2020, District 128 adopted a remote learning model due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Adhering to the directive from the Illinois State Board of Education's mandate to do "no educational harm to any child," students could improve, but not lower, their grade held on the last day of in-person instruction for Spring Semester 2020. No final exams were given. District 128 continues to be remote at the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year but our normal grading procedure has resumed. During eSchool, we are utilizing a modified block schedule, with 75-minute class times.

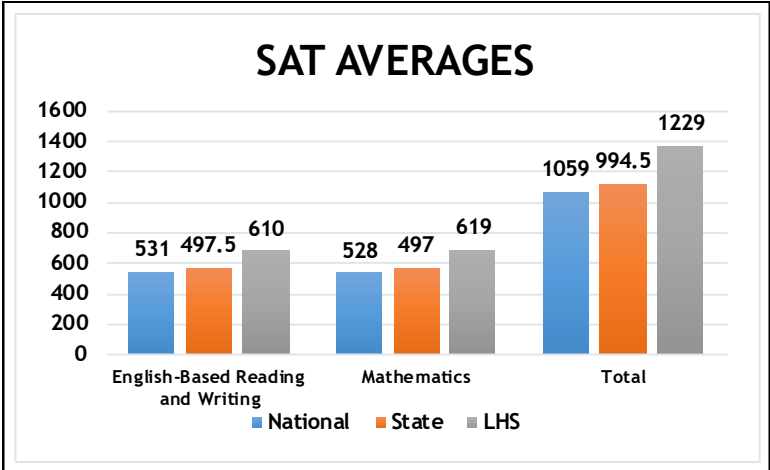
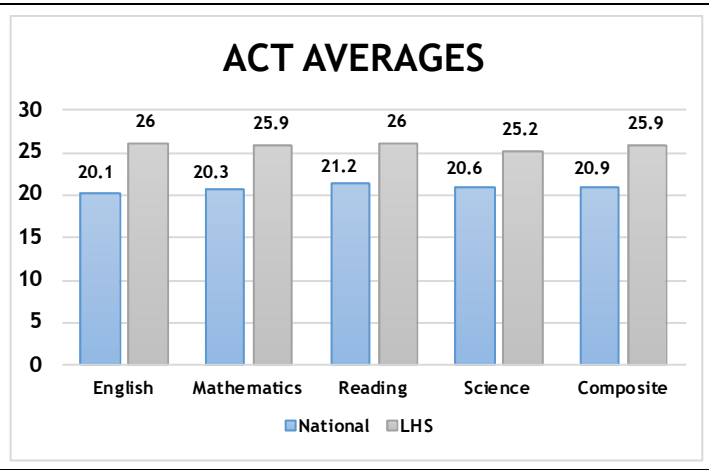
