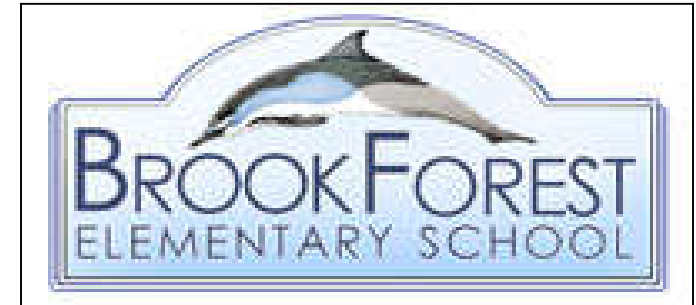
**Fun with Volleyball** - Students and Brook Forest staff are split into teams and play volleyball games.
