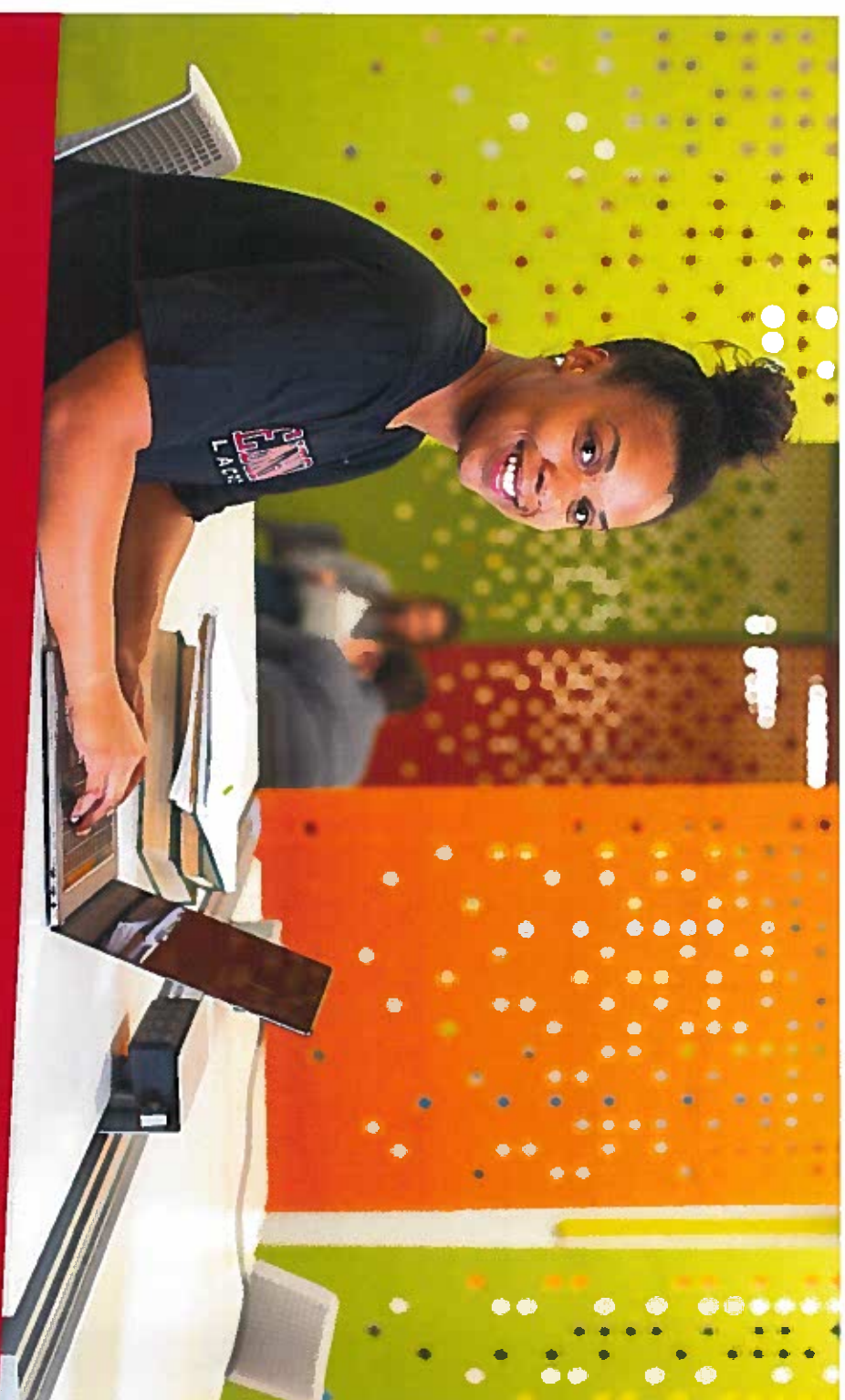

## Obtaining Your Edinboro University Student ID

University policy requires that all students, faculty and staff carry a University ID card at all times while on campus. Plus, you will need your ID for the following activities:

- Accessing student meal plans
- Door access
- Fitness Center admittance
- Obtaining a parking pass
- Checking out books from the Baron-Forness Library
- Entry into University athletic games and cultural events

The Access Office, which is located in the lobby of Lawrence Towers and is responsible for issuing University ID cards, is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. To obtain your ID, you will need to bring a state-issued ID. There is no ID card fee for dual enrollment students. For more information, contact the Access Office at **(814) 732-2635**.

### Parking on Campus

All visitors, students and employees must obtain a valid parking permit from campus police prior to parking on campus.

To obtain a parking permit decal, you must first register your vehicle online. Please log into my.Edinboro, then click on the Parking Permits icon. Decals can be picked up at the University Police Department, 911 Scotland Road, one hour after your online registration is complete.



### Textbooks

Both new and used textbooks are sold at the Campus Bookstore on the lower level of the Frank G. Pogue Student Center. To determine if a textbook is required for your course, please use the comparison tool provided by the Edinboro University bookstore at [edinboro.verbacompare.com](http://edinboro.verbacompare.com).

In addition to textbooks, the Campus Bookstore carries school supplies, Edinboro gear and Fighting Scot spirit items.

### Safety and Emergency Preparedness

Edinboro University uses EU Shield – a mass notification system – to communicate important, time-sensitive information about delays, cancellations, closures or emergency situations via text messages, email, campus televisions, desktop alerts, [edinboro.edu](http://edinboro.edu) and our Facebook and Twitter accounts. All members of the campus community are encouraged to register for the alerts through the EU Shield icon in my.Edinboro.



### my.Edinboro

The my.Edinboro portal provides personalized, one-stop access to a variety of resources, including your student email account, grades, library resources, online learning, campus news and events and more. To log into the my.Edinboro portal, visit [my.edinboro.edu](http://my.edinboro.edu).

If you are accessing my.Edinboro for the first time, click on the "Newly Admitted Students" button to create a password using the login information you received in your acceptance letter. ### Desire2Learn – D2L

Edinboro University uses a learning management system called Desire2Learn (D2L) to create a rich online learning environment for students. The Desire2Learn system allows faculty to post lectures, homework assignments and exams and engage students through online discussions.



Once you are registered for a course and your information has been processed, you will have access to the D2L site through the D2L icon in my.Edinboro.

### Baron-Forness Library

One of the largest and most comprehensive academic libraries in Northwest Pennsylvania, Baron-Forness Library is a seven-story landmark that houses thousands of books, full-text journals and historical documents as well as a computer lab, coffee shop, collaborative spaces and our state-of-the-art Learning Commons. You have full access to these academic resources while you're on campus, and you can use your University ID to withdraw books for off-campus study sessions.

The Learning Commons – located on the second floor of the library – provides students with one-stop access to the Academic Success Center, Center for Career Development and Experiential Learning, Office of Transfer and Adult Student Services, Global Education Office, Testing Center and tutoring services.

### Academic Success Center

### Writing Center

### Transcripts
