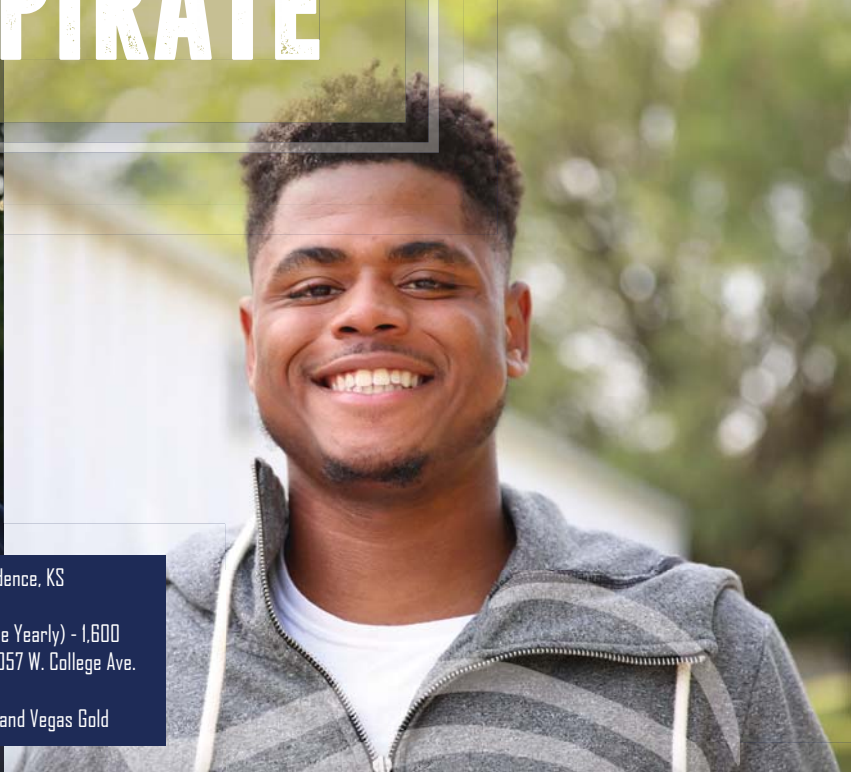

Tammie Geldenhuys

Tammie is in her ninth year as athletic director and 10th year overall at Independence Community College. Prior to moving into the athletic director position in a full-time capacity, she spent the 2008 season as the head volleyball coach, leading the Lady Pirates to an 18-18 season. This is Geldenhuys' second stint at ICC as she also spent two years as head volleyball and women's basketball coach from 1991-93. During that time, she led the volleyball team to a 62-12 mark and two conference runner-up finishes. The basketball squad also finished an undefeated conference championship while posting a 51-16 overall record and fourth place finish at the national tournament. She was named the NJCAA Region VI Junior College Coach of the Year in 1993. Overall, Geldenhuys has spent 15 years as a coach at various levels, including earlier stints in high school at Labette County, Neodesha, Wichita Southeast and Wichita Collegiate. She also spent two seasons as floor coach and recruiter at her alma mater, Kansas State University. During her playing career at K-State, she set 10 team and school records and was a Wade Trophy finalist in 1981 and 1982. In March 2010, her No. 33 Kansas State jersey was retired and hoisted in the rafters of Bramlage Coliseum. Earlier, she was also honored as a member of the first Hall of Fame class at Truman High School in Independence, Mo. Geldenhuys resides in Independence with husband Gerhard, and children: Melissa, Chase, Junior and Dani.

Assistant Athletic Director

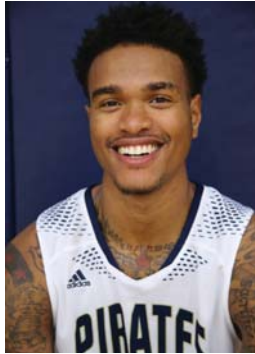
Tony Turner is in his 10th year as assistant athletic director at Independence Community College. He also heads into his fourth season as ICC men's basketball coach after spending the previous several seasons in the women's program as head coach. During his time with the Lady Pirates, Turner compiled a record of 143-51 and now has the most wins as a coach in ICC women's basketball history, including the Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division Coach of the Year award after posting a 30-3 mark and earning a share of the conference title in his second season. Prior to his arrival in Independence, Turner spent one season as the head coach at Allen County Community College. Overall, Turner has a record of 183-75 as a coach at the collegiate level. Turner's coaching career began at the high school level, where he spent time as the assistant boys basketball coach at Shawnee Heights in Topeka. He later moved to Highland Park High School, where he became the women's assistant before moving up to the head coaching position. A graduate of Independence High School, Turner was a standout point guard at ICC, where he held the single-season assists record (244) record for nearly 20 years. Turner and his wife, Molly, have two daughters, D'Ambra and Jasmyn, and a son, Tate.

COACHING STAFF



HOW DO YOU SEE THE CONFERENCE RACE THIS YEAR?

It's tough. I feel sorry for the incoming freshmen. They don't have a month or month and a half to get ready for this conference. These freshmen are going to have to learn on the fly to understand what this conference is all about. I've been around Pirate basketball for a long, long time. I don't think this conference has ever been as tough as it is now. I'm not saying there haven't been better teams and players, but when you have to play 26 conference games, it's an absolute grind.



Tony Turner begins his fourth season as head men's basketball coach at Independence Community College. In his first season with the Pirates, Turner directed the squad to a 21-11 overall record and 11-1 mark in the Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division to earn its first conference championship since 2000. Through three seasons, Turner has compiled a record of 43-48 with the Pirates.

Turner, who also serves as the assistant athletic director at ICC, moved over to the men's program after spending the previous seven seasons as the head coach in the Lady Pirate basketball program. During his time with the ICC women, Turner compiled a record of 143-51 and now has the most wins as a coach in Lady Pirate basketball history, including the Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division Coach of the Year award after posting a 30-3 mark and earning a share of the conference title in his second season.

Prior to his arrival in Independence, Turner spent one season as the head coach at Allen County Community College. Overall, Turner has a record of 183-75 as a coach at the collegiate level. Turner's coaching career began at the high school level, where he spent time as the assistant boys basketball coach at Shawnee Heights in Topeka. WHAT ARE THE STRENGTHS OF YOUR TEAM?

In junior college, with so much turnover, you're just trying to mold a bunch of new guys into what we want. We spent the majority of the preseason getting the guys to understand what we expect and getting rid of a lot of the egos. We have a lot more athleticism and speed. We also have a little more wisdom. The difference from last year to this year is the basketball IQ. They can work on the fly and can go make a play when things break down.

Mike Cyprien starts his first season as an assistant men's basketball coach at Independence Community College.

Cyprien began his collegiate coaching career in 2010 at Rogers State (Okla.) University, where he helped the Hillcats to a 22-12 record, a No. 25 national ranking and a berth in the NAIA Division I Men's Basketball National Championship. RSU closed out the regular season winning 14 of their final 18 games, including wins over No. 10 Oklahoma Baptist and No. 12 Southern Nazarene, while also advancing to the national quarterfinals. He began his overall coaching career in Louisiana as he spent one season with the Hammond-based Shockas Boys and the Jefferson Playground All-Stars of the AAU.

Prior to joining the ICC staff, Cyprien spent three years as an assistant at Southeastern University, an NCAA Division I member. He was also a three-year letterwinner for the Lions, highlighted by a pair of Southland Conference championships. During his time in Hammond, La., Cyprien helped coach three All-Southland players as well as an All-Louisiana and National Association Basketball Coaches Association All-District performer.

In his Southeastern career, Cyprien played in 47 games and helped the Lions to a pair of Southland Conference championships and a berth in the 2005 NCAA Championships.

Cyprien graduated from Southeastern University in 2008 with a Bachelor of Science degree specializing in industrial design.

Chad Bowers enters his first season as an assistant coach in the Independence Community College men's basketball program.

Bowers came to Independence from Dallas, Texas, where he most recently coached at Maceo Smith High School and Wilmer Hutchins High School. He helped post a 21-10 record and a spot in the Texas State semifinals. He also coached the nationally-recognized AAU program Dallas Mustangs.

Prior to becoming a coach, Bowers played at Ranger Junior College in Ranger, Texas, where he majored in Sports Business Management. He continued his career at Southwest Assembly of God in Waxahachie, Texas, where his career ended with an injury.

Bowers has two sons, Chad and Tyler.

An avid Independence Community College supporter for more than 30 years, Tom Tyler has been serving as a volunteer assistant coach on the bench for the Pirate men's basketball program for nearly two decades.

Tyler started as a fan of Pirate athletics when the men's basketball team participated in the 1976 NJCAA Tournament in Hutchinson. Since then, he has volunteered his services to the college in several different capacities while also spending time on the Pirate bench.

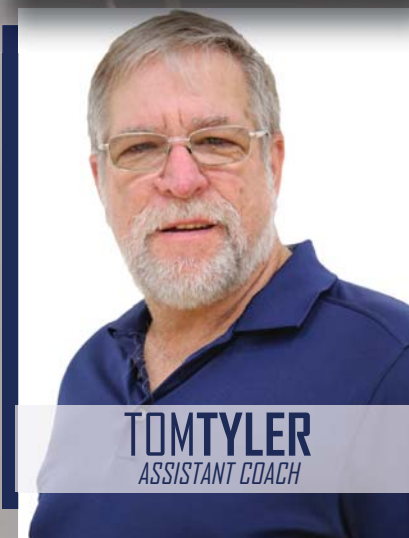

As part of the first-ever national championship team at ICC, Rick Park turned in one of the top individual performances ever seen at an NJCAA Tournament. Against Moberly (Mo.), in the 1963 title game, he had a game-high 39 points, which still stands as the second-highest point total ever recorded in a junior college championship game. For the tournament, Park averaged 32 points per game to earn All-Tournament recognition. He played two seasons at ICC and ranks eighth in career scoring with 1,187 points. He was named an NJCAA All-American and became a member of the NJCAA Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007. Park finished his career at the University of Tulsa and was picked by the Philadelphia 76ers in the 1965 NBA Draft. At the completion of his playing career, Park returned to Independence as head coach and led the Pirates to back-to-back Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division championships in 1974 and 1975.

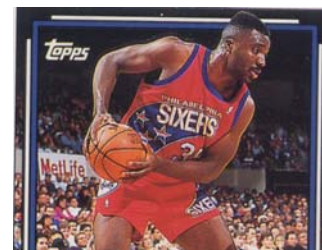

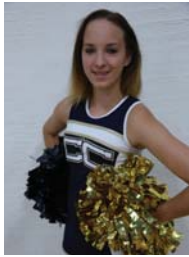
LAVON KENT, HEAD COACH

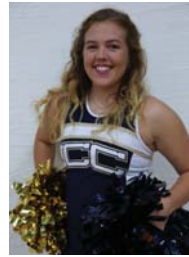

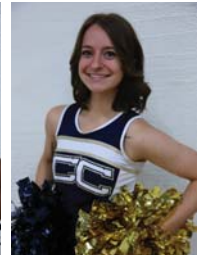

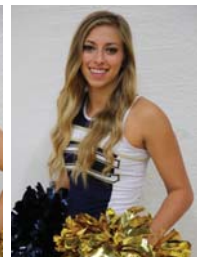

COACHING STAFF



HOW DO YOU SEE THE CONFERENCE RACE THIS YEAR?

It comes down to winning your home games and picking up those wins that you can on the road. When you have a conference like this, it's so competitive that your teams in the Jayhawk Conference aren't probably going to have those 20-plus win seasons. We're beating each other up every night



With 26 years of experience at the high school, junior college and Division I levels, 300 plus wins and coaching four former Olympians, Leslie Crane is in her fourth season as the head women's basketball coach at Independence Community College.

Crane also spent the second semester of the 2012-13 season as the assistant coach for the Lady Pirates. She has plenty of head coaching experience in the Jayhawk Conference as she led Kansas City Kansas Community College from 1993-97. She revitalized the Lady Blue Devil program as her team was ranked in the top 20 of the NJCAA and became the 1997 Region VI champions, advancing to the NJCAA Tournament in Tyler, Texas. During her tenure at KCK, she was the two-time Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division Coach of the Year in 1994 and 1995 and was named the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association Community College Coach of the Year and District D-NJCAA Coach of the Year in 1997.

After her stint at KCK, Crane was the assistant coach at the University of Missouri in Columbia, where she was the recruiting coordinator. She later became the head coach at Western Illinois University from 1998-2011. She won her 150th career game in 2007 against Southern Utah and was the first coach in the school's history to record a 20-win season with a 21-9 mark in the 2002-03 campaign. She was the three-time Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year in 2003, 2004 and 2005.

Crane has also coached select basketball teams internationally, traveling to Barbados, Brazil, Soviet Union and Estonia. Prior to coming to ICC, she worked as a consultant for Sports Tours International as the tournament director responsible for game management and recruiting.

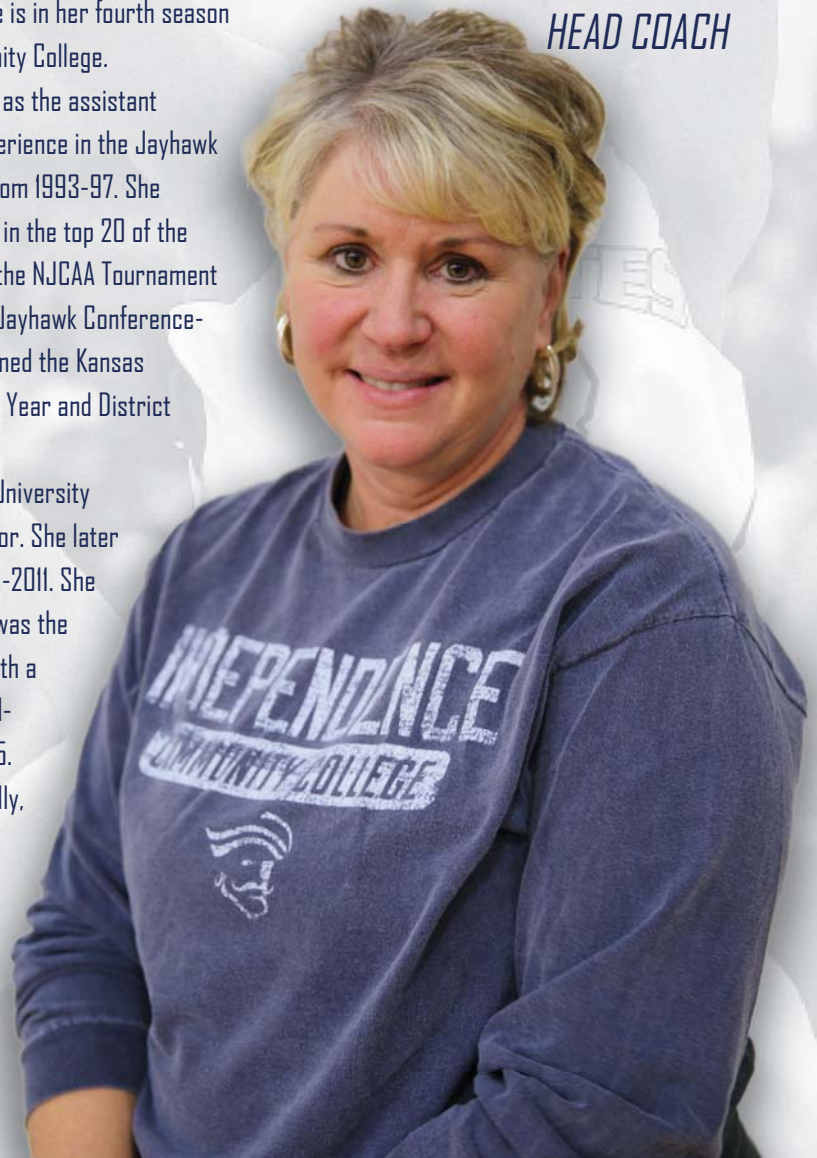


WHAT ARE THE STRENGTHS OF YOUR TEAM?

HEAD COACH



Taylor Floyd starts her fourth season as assistant women's basketball coach at Independence Community College.

A former Lady Pirate basketball player from 2009-11, Floyd capped off her playing career at NCAA Division I Idaho State University, where she spent two seasons. As a junior, she played in 17 games, averaging 2.9 points and 1.4 rebounds per game. She had a season-high 20 points and six rebounds against Oklahoma Panhandle and pulled down 23 boards, scored 49 points and had 10 assists for the season. She saw limited time as a senior, playing in eight games and averaging 1.5 points and 0.6 rebounds per game.

Floyd spent two seasons at ICC, earning All-Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division Second Team and All-Region VI Honorable Mention as a sophomore. During that season, she helped the Lady Pirates post a 30-3 record as she averaged 12.8 points and 6.6 rebounds per game.

Originally from Topeka, Floyd was a 2009 graduate of Shawnee Heights High School, where she lettered in basketball for four years and volleyball for two years. She was twice named First Team All-City and was Second Team all-league and all-state.



A former Lady Pirate basketball player, Kamri Anderson begins her second season as an assistant coach for the Independence women's basketball program.

Prior to returning to ICC, Anderson spent time as the head girls basketball coach at Carver Middle School and volunteer assistant coach at Booker T. Washington High School in Tulsa, Okla.

Anderson played for the Lady Pirates before earning her Associates Degree of Science in Business Administration in 2012. During her ICC career, she was named Second Team All-Region VI as well as Honorable Mention All-Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division. She went on to play two years of basketball at Oklahoma State University of the Big 12 Conference.

A native of Tulsa, Okla., Anderson was an Honorable Mention All-Metro pick by The Tulsa World as a senior in high school. She was selected to compete in the Oklahoma Basketball Coaches Association All-Star Game. She was chosen as a Second Team All-State Tournament pick during her junior campaign. She helped lead her high school squad to a perfect 28-0 mark and a second straight Class 5A state title in 2009.

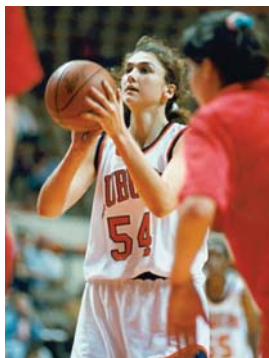

Jeff Tadtman led the Lady Pirates to an 89-21 record in his three seasons as head coach from 1993-96. During that time, his teams won two Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division titles and three straight Region VI crowns. ICC finished eighth nationally in 1994

and 1995 and as the national runner-up in 1996. Tadtman was named the Junior College Coach of the Year by the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Pirate Athletic Hall of Fame in 2014.



Keitha Green (Adams) spent five seasons on the bench for the Lady Pirates from 1996-2001. Green is the second all-time winningest coach in ICC women's basketball history with a career mark of 127-37.

She directed the squad to two Jayhawk-Eastern Division crowns in 2000 and 2001. Green left ICC to become the head coach at the University of Texas in El Paso, where she became the Miners' all-time winningest coach.



During his time with the Lady Pirates from 2006-13, Tony Turner compiled a record of 143-51 and has the most wins as a coach in ICC women's basketball history. He was named the Jayhawk Conference-Eastern Division Coach of the Year

after posting a 30-3 mark and earning a share of the conference title in his second season.
