

GENERAL LAWS	ADMISSIONS AND ATTENDANCE	620
Ch. 15, S.1G	Board of education has power to and does issue regulations with regard to the length of school day and school year and the permissible and mandatory ages for school attendance.	
Ch. 76, S.1	Definitions and provisions of compulsory attendance requirement are set forth in this section.	
Ch. 76, S.2	Prescribes responsibilities of parent or guardian with regard to school attendance and gives juvenile court jurisdiction to enforce the law.	
Ch. 76, S.2A	Mandates that deaf children between the ages of seven and eighteen must attend school.	
Ch. 76, S.3	Requires minors between ages of sixteen and eighteen (except a married woman) who do not meet the requirements for completing sixth grade to attend the evening school.	
Ch. 76, S.4	Provides for any person who “ induces or attempts to induce” a minor to be a truant.	
Ch. 76, S.5	Established right of student to attend school in town in which he resides and prohibits discrimination in admission to school or programs of study.	
Ch. 76, S.6	Provides for payment (or waiver of payment) of tuition for non-resident children.	
Ch. 76, S.7	Provides manner in which Commonwealth reimburses towns for children placed in foster or other homes which are not in the same town in which parents reside.	
Ch. 76, S.9	Provides for reimbursement for students from foster home when regional high school is in other town.	
Ch. 76, S.10	Towns must invoice one another for non-resident students on July 1 with payment due within three months thereafter.	
Ch. 76, S.11	Provides manner in which tuition can be charged for instruction given a child in an institution.

Ch. 76, S.12	Allows a town to pay for education of a student in another town under terms set by the two school committees.
Ch. 76, S.12A	Permits school committees to adopt and implement plans which reduce racial imbalance in other towns.
Ch. 76, S.13	Superintendent required to furnish transfer cards for pupils who move.
Ch. 76, S.19	School committees must appoint a supervisor of attendance (who may also work for other school committees).
Ch. 76, S.20	Gives powers and duties of attendance supervisors.
