<p data-bbox="256 260 315 294"><u>671.</u></p> <p data-bbox="198 327 375 426">School Transportation Services</p> <p data-bbox="185 562 388 596">Adopted 10/9/97</p> <p data-bbox="198 663 315 697">Amended</p> <p data-bbox="198 730 290 793">10/1/03 2/28/07</p>	<p data-bbox="448 260 1414 323">The purpose of this policy is to provide uniform guidelines for transporting students to and from school, and to and from school-sanctioned events.</p> <p data-bbox="448 369 1463 695">The district operates a tiered system where one driver and bus is responsible for the delivery of students to several schools in the morning and returning them home in the afternoon. In addition to transporting students to Shrewsbury Public Schools, the district is required to provide transportation to school-committee approved private schools (i.e., St. John’s High School, St. Mary’s, Lilliput, Montessori, Al-Hamra Academy). Operating a tiered system enables the district to provide reasonable, safe, and economical transportation services for the students of Shrewsbury. The document of the Shrewsbury Public Schools entitled, <u>Transportation Procedures and Regulations</u>, shall govern matters not covered within this policy and is available on the school department’s website.</p> <p data-bbox="813 737 1097 770" style="text-align: center;">Roles and Responsibilities</p> <ul data-bbox="448 814 1463 1881" style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="448 814 1463 1062">• It is the responsibility of parents and guardians to ensure the safe movement of their children to and from district bus stops, and supervise their children’s behavior while at the bus stop. Parents/guardians and students shall be responsible for understanding the bus safety vehicle rules and discipline regulations. Students must demonstrate appropriate behaviors: inappropriate behavior will be subject to the discipline guidelines described in <u>Transportation Procedures and Regulations</u> (attached). The guidelines relative to student discipline will be printed in student handbooks and planners.</li> <li data-bbox="448 1108 1442 1209">• The district will randomly deploy video surveillance cameras on school buses to monitor students and drivers. Videotapes may be viewed by district employees or contractors in the investigation of reported incidents.</li> <li data-bbox="448 1255 1398 1356">• Bus routes, whenever possible, will be similar in length and number of students, consistent with the most efficient transportation route structure. Students will not be delivered to school more than 30 minutes prior to the start of school.</li> <li data-bbox="448 1402 1390 1503">• School buses shall carry only authorized student passengers, bus company staff, and school personnel. Exceptions will be made only with the express permission of the superintendent of schools.</li> <li data-bbox="448 1549 1442 1692">• When possible, students participating in off-campus curricular and co-curricular activities under the direction and supervision of school personnel shall be transported to and from such activities by vehicles operating under contract to the Shrewsbury Public Schools.</li> <li data-bbox="448 1738 1458 1881">• Transportation issues questions and concerns should first be directed to the district’s transportation coordinator. If an individual feels further consideration is needed, inquiries will then be directed to the director of business services. 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- All accidents involving school buses, however minor, shall be reported to the transportation coordinator immediately following the occurrence, followed by a written report within 24 hours. The report will contain all the pertinent information about the incident, including a list of those injured. The transportation coordinator will insure that a copy of the report is submitted to the police department.
- It is the intent of this policy to insure that all school committee transportation regulations and statements of policy (including bus-evacuation drills) are in harmony with and comply with the regulations of the Massachusetts General Laws

Transportation Eligibility Guidelines

Transportation service to students will be provided in accordance with MGL C:71 Section 68 for students in kindergarten to grade 6 for those students who live two or more miles from their assigned school. The district must also provide transportation to special needs students if it is included as a requirement in their Individual Education Plan (I.E.P.) and to students attending out-of-district vocational schools. The district is not required to provide transportation for any other students, regardless of road conditions. The school committee may provide service to other students for a fee. The bus fee will be waived for students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch. However, they may be charged an application/processing fee in order to receive a bus pass. Bus fees will be set and periodically reviewed by the school committee.
