



57	This is both a vague and loaded question. How well the remote lesson plans are working will vary from week to week based on many factors. Is my child able to easily access the assignment herself? Is it a simple worksheet? How much technology is required (Zoom, newer apps, videos, etc.) and how much time will be required for a parent to assist their child in using that technology? It's also directly relative to the extent that our child can understand the assignment. In the beginning, the assignments were much easier - math worksheets, watch a video and answer questions, etc. However, as at-home learning continues the assignments are becoming more detailed and complex and our child is requiring a lot of assistance to simply understand the instructions. And lastly, how well the remote lesson plans are working is relative to how independently our child can complete the actual assignment based on the complexity or the 'newness' of the topic. Some assignments included newer math concepts, which required a lot of support and even with our help she's still struggling. Recently, the assignments have carried over from week to week, building upon the previous assignment, and this is becoming very difficult to manage. It requires parents holding onto a lot of paperwork week to week. And these assignments contain a lot of details to keep track of ask the assignments progress. The detailed ELA assignments with informative pillars and the timeline for social studies all require a lot of writing. Also, these ELA and social studies assignments have been carrying over for several weeks, as has an ongoing science assignment where they are drawing and observing a plant each week. The recent science assignment has many parts to it, as in watching a series of videos and the questions they need to answer aren't simple "yes/no" responses. They are requiring answers with expanded thought showing a deeper comprehension - which is great, except this is requiring a lot of one-on-one guidance from parents to ensure they understand the material.	4/29/2020 10:21 PM




