

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION MAKE UP AND EXTENDED MEDICAL EXCUSE MAKE UP POLICY

<p><b>Individual Class Make Ups</b></p>	<p>Because P.E. is largely participation based, missing class can affect a student's grade.</p> <p>Refer to the course syllabus and speak with the instructor to determine when to complete a make-up.</p> <p>In certain situations, a student may check out a heart rate monitor from their instructor and complete a make-up on their own time outside of school. <b><u>Students are responsible for the cost of a lost or stolen heart rate monitor.</u></b></p>
<p><b>Medical Excuses*</b></p> <p><i>(We ask that parents assist us in requesting their physician to provide feedback describing modified physical activities that <u>can be</u> performed within the class structure.)</i></p>	<p><b>The physical education department is consistently working with the nurse's office to contact parents &amp; physicians regarding options for modified activity.</b></p> <p>All students, regardless of condition, must still dress for physical education. Exceptions include but not limited to casts and immobilizers that make it difficult to change clothing.</p> <p>Every effort will be made to keep the student engaged in P.E. and modify activity accordingly. In addition, the cognitive portion of the course is still expected to be completed. In addition, some physical expectations as dictated by the course syllabus <u>must</u> be made up. Speak with the instructor to determine the make-up needs.</p> <p>P.E. instructors are expected to provide some form of alternative assignments; (physical or written). If no alternative assignments are provided, the excused time period <u>will not</u> count toward the student's final grade.</p>

\* The current policy works for the majority of situations that occur. However an issue may arise where a separate decision may need to be made that does not coincide with this policy.
