

## Resource Rooms/Library

All resource rooms and the Library are provided as a service to students. Students are expected to demonstrate respect for teachers/peers and to follow guidelines. If a student wishes to go to the Library or a resource center during a lunch resource or study hall period, he/she should report directly to the Library or resource center before the tardy bell. Some rooms require a signed pass by a teacher.

<b>English</b> Computer Lab	The English Computer Lab is accessible for students to work on assignments including essays, presentations, online research, etc. The Lab also provides writing software tutorials to help students in a variety of subjects, including programs to improve their scores on standardized tests such as the ACT. A pass from an English teacher is required for admission during the school day, but no pass is needed for before or after school assistance. <b>English</b> Literacy Center	Students can visit the Literacy Center for assistance from peer tutors and/or teachers on reading strategies and all aspects of the writing process: planning, drafting, revising, and publishing. Students can attend voluntarily, or by teacher recommendation. All tutoring sessions are drop-in. <i>Student can also get assistance in the Literacy Center on writing assignments in Science and Social Studies classes.</i>	<b>B323B</b>	<b>Periods 4, 5, 6 &amp; 8 and Tues. – Thurs. 7:30-7:55 &amp; 3:30-4:00</b>
<b>Library</b>	Students may use the Library on a first come first serve basis during periods that they have study hall, resource or lunch. Students may also use the Library before or after school. (7 – 4:30) Student IDs are required at all times except before school. Entry during the lunch periods (4, 5 & 6) is according to last name. (Monday & Thursday - A through M, Tuesday & Friday - N through Z, Wednesday – Gold Card holders only). Attendance is taken in the library, so students must arrive before the bell. During periods 1, 2, 3, 7 and 8 students not assigned to the Mustang Corral will need a pass from a librarian. Students who want to ensure entry on a particular day or period can obtain Library passes outside of class time by asking library staff for these passes.	<b>Library A100</b>	<b>7:00 – 4:30</b>

<b>Math</b> Math Resource	Students using the Math Resource are expected to be on time and have their Student ID to scan for attendance. Students are to be seated at a table/computer, work on mathematics for the period and be prepared with materials and questions.	<b>D374</b>	<b><u>Monday – Friday</u></b> <b>7:20 – 3:20</b>
<b>World Language</b> Language Technology – (A201) World Language Resource Center (A202)	The Language Technology Lab is open from <b>7:20-7:55 am and from 3:25-4:15 pm for students who want to drop in.</b> During the rest of the day students must be with a class. Students are to work on specific assignments that involve the use of content area related technology. The Resource Center is open for tutoring and content area related computer work during lunch periods only. <b>Testing Center</b>	The Testing Center is available for students who need to make-up quizzes or tests. Students will need to show their current ID to use the center. The room is equipped with audio equipment for listening to tapes/CD's, as well as TV's with VCR and DVD players. Written activities can also be made up in the center.
