This is report of the use of institutional funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to institutions on April 22, 2020.

- The total amount of funds that AMBS received \$6219.00 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Institutions.
- \$1,008.40 of Emergency Financial Aid Grants was used by buying a Meeting Owl to enhance classes and meeting environments for faculty, staff and students; \$570 was used by Brent Graber, Director of Information Technology, for his time creating resources for teaching faculty to strengthen their technology skills teaching students; and \$4,640.60 for Moodle licensing for students and faculty to be able to seamlessly learn from different modalities as needed in response to Covid-19 for a total of \$6,219.00 under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).
- 66 students at AMBS were eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- Departments were informed that these Emergency Financial Aid Grants are to be used for food, housing, course material, technology, health care, or child care related to disturbances related to the Covid 19 pandemic.
