This is report of the use of institutional funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to institutions on April 22, 2020.

- The total amount of funds that AMBS received \$6219.00 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Institutions.
- \$1,008.40 of Emergency Financial Aid Grants was used by buying a Meeting Owl; \$570 was used by staff, Brent Graber, Director of Information Technology, for his time creating resources for teaching faculty to use teaching students for a total of \$1,578.00 under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter). AMBS will gather applications in the next 45 days again for use of the institutional funds by departments who are affected by the Covid 19 pandemic. We anticipate distributing the full remaining funds of the \$6219.00 as we realize that there has been and will continue to be economic disturbances amongst our institution due to the Covid 19 pandemic. There has been an email sent out inviting staff and faculty to apply for the remaining funds.
- 62 students at AMBS were eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- Teresa Sherrill, Enrollment and Financial Aid Specialist, will meet with various staff to decide by mid August 2020 according to eligibility requirements and application content which areas of the institution will receive a remainder of the disbursement under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- Departments were informed that these Emergency Financial Aid Grants are to be used for food, housing, course material, technology, health care, or child care related to disturbances related to the Covid 19 pandemic.
