1. Elkhart to Plymouth (40.6 miles) – 8:30–9:30 a.m.

MENOMINEE STATUE

(http://www.potawatomi-tda.org/indiana/chiefms.htm) erected 1909 is the start of the Trail of Death.

- ➤ Meet hosts at Menominee Statue
  - George Schricker will sing Chief Menominee song
  - Commissioning of pilgrims → Walk to visit site of old chapel, then app. 2 miles on county road: south and then east following Old Michigan Rd.
- 2. Plymouth to Rochester (21 miles) 12–1 p.m.
  - $\succ$  Lunch on the road

> MUD CREEK (<u>http://www.potawatomi-tda.org/indiana/mudcreek.htm</u>) Drive south of Rochester on Indiana 25 for 5 miles to Mud Creek. The Trail of Death marker is on the west side of the highway and north side of the creek. - Stop at Tippecanoe River and note that Treaty Tree is nearby. - 3. Rochester to Delphi (45 miles) 1–3 p.m.
   Drive past Logansport Hospital see marker
- 4. Camp at Delphi at the <u>Wabash and Erie Canal Interpretive Center</u>

DELPHI CANAL - Sale of Potawatomi land by the state raised funds for this canal (http://www.potawatomi-tda.org/indiana/delphicc.htm). The canal was being dug as Potawatomi deportees passed.
