Murry, prelate of the Catholic Church, member of the Jesuit Order, and bishop of Youngstown, OH. The trip includes a conference sponsored by the Ignatian Solidarity Network, an advocacy day on Capitol Hill, and visits to Washington, D.C. points of interest such as the Smithsonian, the Holocaust Museum and the Monuments.
