CULTURAL IMMERSION

The first half of the trip will be spent exploring the city of Quito, Ecuador and surrounding areas. This trip will be an immersive experience into the influential art, the magnificent architecture of places like the Church of Santo Domingo, and the deep and complex history of both evolving and traditional cultures on the west coast of South America. While in Ecuador, we will visit the equator, visit markets, and experience traditional meals.

The second half of the trip will be spent on the Galapagos Islands. Here, we will travel in the steps of Charles Darwin, which led him to his Theory of Evolution, revolutionizing the science world. In the days inside the National Park, which covers 97% of the land of the island, and one of the largest marine sanctuaries in the world, we will immerse ourselves into the biodiversity that exists in both the land and water. Our experience will include a service project to help preserve and pass on our experiences.
