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Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to enclose our Department of Secondary and Elementary Education (DESE) Massachusetts School report card overview. Report cards answer important questions about a school's overall performance and contain specific information about student enrollment and teacher qualifications, student achievement, accountability, how a school is performing relative to other schools in the district and the state, and the progress made toward narrowing proficiency gaps for different groups of students.

In this report you will find the following important information about our school:

Student enrollment and teacher quality: This section of the report card provides information about the students and teachers in our school as compared to the district and the state. If your child attends a school that receives federal Title I funds, you also have the right to request the following information about the qualifications of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether your child's teacher is licensed in the grade levels and subject areas they teach
- Whether your child's teacher is teaching under an emergency license or waiver
- The college degree and major of your child's teacher
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications

Assessment results: This section of the report shows how our students are performing on the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) tests as compared to the district and the state.

School and district accountability information: This section of the report contains three important pieces of information:

- **Accountability and Assistance Levels:** Schools and districts are placed into one of five accountability and assistance levels (1-5), with the highest performing in Level 1 and lowest performing in Level 5. Our school has been placed into Level 2 because we are progressing towards gap narrowing goals.
- **School Percentiles:** A school percentile between 1 and 99 is reported for most schools. This number shows the overall performance of our school relative to other schools that serve the same or similar grades. Our school percentile is 40.

This means that our school is performing higher than 40 percent of the elementary/middle/high/etc. schools in the state.

• Progress and Performance Index (PPI): The PPI is a number that indicates our school's progress towards narrowing proficiency gaps, or, in other words, helping all students reach proficiency and be prepared for success after high school. Massachusetts has set a goal of reducing proficiency gaps by half between the years 2011 and 2017. For a group of students to be considered to be making sufficient progress toward narrowing proficiency gaps, its cumulative PPI must be 75 or higher.

LEVEL 2-5 SCHOOLS: To improve student achievement in our school, we are continuing the following programs:

To ensure academic success through all four years we continue the following programs:

- GradPoint is an academic on-line program in English, science, social studies, and math to allow students an opportunity for credit recovery.
- In October we administered the PSAT tests to all sophomores and juniors to prepare them for the SAT. Test results are currently being analyzed by administration and department chairs to make necessary changes in curriculum and instruction.
- Support systems to assist those who are currently academically at risk in academic courses. We use the state early warning indicators to identify those students who would benefit from extra academic support, in addition to piloting a general education academic support class.
- Math and writing labs are scheduled and available as general education supports for all students.
- Mid-year and final exam grades are reported on student report cards.
- iParent will be replaced by the X2/Aspen Student information system in January 2017.
