TRIBAL AND PARENT INVOLVEMENT IN DECISION-MAKING

In accordance with federal law and regulations, the Menominee Indian School District Board of Education shall:

- a. Ensure that Indian children participate in programs and activities supported by impact aid funds on an equal basis with all other District students;
- b. Disseminate to Tribal officials and parents of Indian children;
 1. the impact aid application annually;
 2. any evaluations of education programs assisted with impact aid funds; and
 3. any program plans for education programs that the District plans to initiate or eliminate.
- c. Consult actively with and regularly involve Tribal officials and parents of Indian children in the planning and development of education programs assisted with impact aid funds; and
- d. At least annually afford Tribal officials and parents of Indian children an opportunity to:
 1. Make recommendations concerning the needs of their children, and the ways in which they can assist their children in realizing the benefits to be derived from the education programs assisted with impact aid funds; and
 2. Present their overall views on the education program in the District, including the operation of the District's education program, and the degree of parental participation allowed.
 3. Respond in writing to comments and recommendations made by tribes or parents of Indian children and disseminate the responses to the tribe and parents of Indian children prior to the submission of the IPPs.

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e. Modify IPP's if necessary, based upon the results of any assessment or input.

District procedures shall be established to accomplish the objectives set forth in federal law and regulations.
