TEACHING ABOUT HIV/AIDS

Human immunodeficiency virus/acquired immune deficiency syndrome (HIV/AIDS) is recognized as a major community health issue. Because of the serious nature of this disease and the importance of preventing its transmission, the Menominee Indian School District shall develop an HIV/AIDS education program for implementation in the district.

The District's HIV/AIDS education program shall:

1. present clear and factually accurate information concerning the disease and its transmission;
2. provide opportunities for participation by students, parents, citizens and medical experts;
3. include a sequential curriculum tailored to students' emotional and intellectual level of development and to their grade level;
4. encourage students to practice healthy behavior and develop positive self-concepts;
5. incorporate staff inservice training about the disease and its transmission, and information about the HIV/AIDS education program to be presented to students; and
6. provide for advance parental notification of HIV/AIDS presentations to students.

Any parent or guardian who objects to his/her child's participation may have him/her excused from the presentation.

HIV/AIDS education program proposals shall be approved by the Board.
