HIGH SCHOOL GRADING PROCEDURES

1. The high school grading system is as follows:

- A - Excellent
- B - Above Average
- C - Average
- D - Below Average
- F - Failure
- I - Incomplete

2. Computing Grade Point Average

Grade point averages will be calculated as follows:

3. Determining Class Valedictorian/Academic Excellence Scholarship Recipient and Salutatorian

The valedictorian/academic excellence scholarship recipient shall be the student who has the highest grade point average at the end of seven high school semesters, with at least 21 credits. The salutatorian shall be the student who has the second highest grade point average.

- a. The student must have attended Menominee Indian School District for a minimum of four full semesters prior to the senior year and must maintain their senior year as a full time student (at least six credits).
- b. Work experience, driver education, lab assistant, and any course taken on a pass/fail basis will not be used in the calculation of the grade point average nor the 21 credit minimum requirement. Administrative discretion will be used regarding transfer courses of a unique nature.
- c. Tie Breaker - In case of a tie for the valedictorian or salutatorian, the following tie breakers will be employed:
 1. Difficulty of curriculum as defined in the school handbook.
 2. If the tie is not broken after (1) above, the average daily attendance for all four years in high school will be observed.
 3. If the tie is not broken after (2) above, contributions to the Menominee Indian High School will be considered including, but not limited to: elected positions, extracurricular clubs and organizations, and athletics.
 4. If the tie is not broken after (3) above, ACT/SAT scores will be used.
 5. If the tie is not broken after (4) above; a review committee composed of an administrator, a counselor and one member from each of the following disciplines will vote to decide the winner: mathematics, science, social studies, English, elective.
