### FOOD SERVICES MANAGEMENT

The school food service program is an integral part of the total education program, and as such shall be governed by the same principles and type of control as any other division of the school system.

The District shall provide breakfast and lunch through participation in federal child nutrition programs. The head bookkeeper shall enter into an agreement with the department of public instruction (DPI) and the federal government for participation in such child nutrition programs.

As required for participation in federal child nutrition programs, the District agrees to the following:

- That school meals meeting federal regulations be made available for all students.
- That free and reduced price meals be offered to students who apply and who meet the federal eligibility guidelines.

The head bookkeeper is responsible for the management of the food service program, including the purchase of food and materials. He/she may delegate specific duties in relation to the school food service programs to the head cooks.

Vending machines may be installed in District schools when approved by the Board of Education.

The District shall prohibit the sale of foods of minimal nutritional value in the food services areas during the lunch period. Categories of foods of minimal nutritional value include: (1) soda water, (2) water ices, (3) chewing gum, and (4) certain hard candies, jellies and gums, marshmallow candies, fondant, licorice, spun candy and candy-coated popcorn. This prohibition applies to all food sales in the food service areas, including sales from vending machines.

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Food services programs shall be reviewed annually.

The District shall not discriminate in school-sponsored food service programs on the basis of age, sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, color, pregnancy, marital or parental status, homelessness status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
