GRANTS AND GIFTS FROM PRIVATE SOURCES

The Board of Education may accept and use any bequest or gift of money or property for a purpose deemed by the Board to be consistent with District goals. Any gift presented to the District should be accompanied by a letter from the donor for official action and recognition of the Board.

To be accepted, a gift shall:

- have a purpose consistent with those of the school;
- be offered by a donor acceptable to the Board;
- not begin a program which the Board would be unwilling to continue when gift or grant funds are exhausted;
- not bring undesirable or hidden costs to the District;
- place no restrictions on the school programs;
- not be inappropriate or harmful to the best education of students;
- not imply endorsement of any business or product; and
- not be in conflict with any provisions of policy, laws or regulations.

All gifts, grants and bequests shall become school property to be used at the discretion of the school unless otherwise specified in the bequest. Equipment and materials purchased for or donated to the public school by agencies or organizations outside of the school must have approval of the Board.

The Menominee Indian School District shall not discriminate in the acceptance and administration of gifts, grants, scholarships or other aids, benefits or services to students from private agencies, organizations or persons on the basis of sex, race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
