EARLY ADMISSION TO FOUR YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN

Children who meet the age requirements of the State of Wisconsin are enrolled in four year old kindergarten, a child must be four years old on or before September 1st of the year he/she wishes to be enrolled. To be enrolled in kindergarten, a child must be five years old on or before September 1st of the year he/she wishes to be enrolled. A child must be six years old on or before September 1 of the year he/she wishes to be enrolled in first grade. Students may be admitted early to four year kindergarten with a 3.10 months age eligibility in accordance with established procedures.

Students are registered in the second semester of the prior school year at specified dates to be widely publicized by the administration. Student registration is to be completed no later than the first week of school. Children transferring into the Menominee Indian School District after the first week will have records reviewed for placement.

A legal document (i.e., birth certificate, immunization record, passport, etc.) must be presented at the time of registration as proof of age, except as otherwise provided.

Special Education: Preschool Entrance Age

Children identified as having a disability may be enrolled in a school program before the age of five in accordance with state and federal laws and regulations.
