STUDENT CONDUCT

Students in the Menominee Indian School District shall be expected to act in such fashion that their behavior will reflect favorably on the individual student and on the school, show consideration for fellow students, and create a harmonious school atmosphere. To accomplish this, each student must recognize individual responsibilities and obligations, and discharge them in accordance with school regulations.

Students are expected to abide by classroom rules, rules established for each school and the Board-approved code of classroom conduct. Any student who violates the code of classroom conduct may be subject to removal from class and/or disciplinary action.

All employees shall share responsibility for supervising the behavior of students and for seeing that they meet established standards of conduct. In enforcing rules for student conduct, staff members shall place particular emphasis upon educating students in the ability to control themselves.

The District shall not discriminate in standards and rules of behavior, including student harassment, on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
