STUDENT ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG ABUSE (AODA)

It is the policy of the Menominee Indian School District that students have the right to attend school in an environment that is free from the non-medical use of alcohol, drugs, and controlled substances. These substances are harmful and interfere with the learning environment and performance of students. The District is committed to a program to prevent the abuse of alcohol and the illegal use of controlled substances and/or alcohol by students.

The District prohibits the following activities by students in any school building or on school premises; any school-owned vehicle or other vehicle used to transport students to and from school or school activities; or off school property during any school sponsored or approved activity, event, or function where students are under the supervision of the District;

- Sale or delivery of illicit drugs, alcohol, controlled substances or "look-alike" drugs;
- Manufacture, possession, use (including consumption or being under the influence), or feigning the use of illicit drugs, alcohol or controlled substances (including inhalants);
- Possession or use of drug paraphernalia, including any device whose primary purpose or intended uses is to produce, process, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance or controlled substance analog; and
- Misuse of legal drugs.

This policy does not extend to the use of prescription medications when used by the individual for whom they are prescribed, when used in the manner and amounts prescribed, and when used in accordance with other school policies governing student medications.

If a school official or police officer has reasonable suspicion that a student is under the influence of alcohol in violation of this policy, he/she may require the student to submit to a breathalyzer test to determine the presence of alcohol. This test shall be administered by a police officer. The results of the breathalyzer test or the fact that a student refused to submit to breath testing shall be considered in student disciplinary proceedings.

All District students are required to abide by the terms of this policy. Any violation of this policy shall result in disciplinary action up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution. Appropriate action shall be taken in accordance with law, Board policies and established procedures.

Medical Emergencies

Because of the potential danger presented by acute intoxication with alcohol or other drugs, students exhibiting evidence of acute intoxication, incapacitation, or drug overdoses in school or at school sponsored events shall be reported to Menominee Central Dispatch for immediate transportation to the closest hospital or facility designed to provide medical services followed by immediate notification of parent(s)/guardian. Following the student's return to school, appropriate discipline shall be implemented.
