STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

The Board of Education promotes physical, social and emotional health for all District students and recognizes the need for limited student health services. This area shall be referred to as Student Health Services and is under the direction of a nurse(s) registered in Wisconsin. The nurse(s) ensure that students receive a variety of services ranging from emergency nursing services to health education. Student health services shall be provided in accordance with established procedures.

1. Emergency nursing services shall be provided to students by registered nurse(s) and/or trained designees in accordance with state laws and regulations and established procedures.
2. Preventive programs may also be provided which include vision, hearing, nutritional, scoliosis screenings, and asthma intervention program.
3. Schools may also offer the fluoride, tooth brushing and/or visual dental exam programs to improve oral health.

The Board authorizes the Tribal Clinic to provide health-related services within the District as needed, in accordance with established guidelines. This includes the distribution of condoms and excludes distribution of unauthorized medication.
