KPS students, led by teacher Amy Bohr, did a great job restoring five raised garden beds at the school that had not been used for the past three years.

“Everyone involved in the effort were volunteers, with many students each putting in several hours of time to weed and plant. It was a major job,” said Bohr. One of the gardens is decorative with flowers and Hostas; there is a 3 Sisters Garden; a medicine garden and two

vegetable gardens.

The gardens will be used by the science class during summer school and KPS STEM classes will also use the garden for instructions this fall. In addition, KPS Menominee Language and Culture teachers will use the tobacco, sweet grass and sage from the medicine gardens.

“This is great news, and shows the hard work and dedication put in by teachers, students and staff is paying off,” said MISD Superintendent Wendell Waukau.

“Receiving this recognition means our students understand what is expected of them and that positive behavior is the norm and not an exception. Still, having said that, it’s important for everyone to understand this is an ongoing process; not a one-time thing.” Waukau noted that behavior has a direct impact on academic success.

He added, “Because

we want all students to succeed, we’ll continue to focus on expecting positive behaviors in the future.”

PBIS is a research-based, school-wide approach to improving school climate. The process focuses on improving a school’s ability to teach expectations and support positive behavior for all students.
