

What Health Paperwork does my Child need for 2019?

Please take the time to fill out your child's **allergies and medical conditions** in **RenWeb**, the re-enrollment system.

By doing so, information about an allergy (like a nut allergy) or condition (like diabetes) can be quickly shared with those teaching and caring for your child.

More sensitive health information can be hand written on our 2019 Medical Update form, and is **only shared with teachers on a "need to know" basis.**

FAQ's

What is the “Consent for Nursing Services?”

Nursing services in Non-public schools are outlined in the State of New Jersey’s Chapter 226 Laws of 1991. At RPRY, nursing services for children in K-8 are provided by the Educational Services Commission of NJ, Middlesex Regional Division. Nursing Services in the Early Childhood Center are provided privately by RPRY.

You must either opt-in OR opt out for your child.

If you choose to opt-out of Nursing services, your child will not receive screenings such as vision, hearing and scoliosis screenings. **However, your child cannot access the health office during the school day, and no first aid will be given by the school nurse except in the case of severe, life-threatening emergency.**

If you choose to opt-in to Nursing services, you can withdraw your consent at any time.

Consent for Chapter 226 Nursing services is a paper-based consent, and needs to be signed and returned to the Health Office

What is the Consent to Treat in RenWeb? Why is it important?

By clicking “yes” to Consent to Treat in RenWeb, you are agreeing to have RPRY secure emergency medical services for your child in the case of a life threatening emergency. Please ensure your preferred hospital or Emergency Room is entered in RenWeb, and your emergency contacts are up to date.

No medication or treatments are ever given to a child at RPRY without your knowledge, consent, and a valid doctor’s order.

Does RPRY accept religious exemptions from mandatory vaccinations?

No religious exemptions are accepted. High vaccination rates keep the entire school community healthy, and prevent the spread of communicable disease.

Why do I need to renew my child’s medication order every year?

It is both the policy of the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey, and Rabbi Pesach Raymon Yeshiva, that all medication orders be valid for 1 year only.

No medication is kept in the Health office over the summer, and all inhalers, Epipens and pills are sent home at the end of the school year.



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My insurance only allows for 1 well visit a year. How can I get these forms filled out?

It is usually not necessary to make an appointment to have physical forms filled out, as long as your child's yearly physical is up to date. Each pediatrician's office has its own policies, and RPRY encourages you to call your doctor's office with questions.

Forms for the nurse can be scanned and sent to nurse@rpry.org, or faxed to the main office at RPRY.

How do I know if my child has all the required immunizations?

You can obtain a copy of your child's immunization record from your pediatrician's office.
