

Student Government

The student body of Feather River College is organized into a self-governing body known as the Associated Students of Feather River College or ASFRC. This body is an integral part of the college community, recognized by the Superintendent/President and the Board of Trustees of the District, and functions under the Associated Students Constitution, copies of which are available at the ASFRC office. All students at FRC are automatically members of the ASFRC. The ASFRC meets weekly and notices of meetings are posted in advance. All students are strongly encouraged to attend. Students who are not officers may vote after attending three meetings. Elections for executive officers are traditionally held in the spring, with supplemental elections for committee representatives in the fall. The ASFRC officers plan activities for the entire student body under the guidance of the Chief Student Services Officer.

Shared Governance

The ASFRC is an integral component of the College's shared governance structure. Under shared governance, members of the different groups which make up the college community – students, classified staff, faculty, and administrators - are all involved in the process by which policies are made and college actions are determined. ASFRC officers may serve on these committees and all students are strongly encouraged to participate on them. These student representatives are then responsible for bringing committee information back to the ASFRC meetings for input in the College's planning and decision making process.

Student Body Officers

President

The president is the executive officer and the official representative of the students of FRC. The president:

- Presides at all ASFRC meetings and attends the College President's Cabinet meetings.
- Prepares the agenda for all ASFRC meetings with the help of the secretary/treasurer.
- Attends community meetings for public relations purposes, when appropriate.
- Prepares a report for presentation at ASFRC meetings regarding other meetings attended.
- Is actively involved in representing the ASFRC on campus and in the community.

Vice President/Director of Activities:

- Fulfills the President's duties, if for any reason the president is unable to.
- Chairs all Inter-Club Council (ICC) meetings and initiates the first meetings of potential (new) clubs.
- Organizes student elections.
- Maintains a resource file of activities.
- Appoints two chairpersons to assist with the planning, organization, and coordination of events and activities.

- Prepares evaluations of student activities and announces upcoming events at ASFRC meetings.
- Is actively involved in representing the ASFRC on campus and in the community.

Secretary/Treasurer:

- Prepares typed copies of the minutes of past meetings and agendas for upcoming meetings, and distributes them to members of ASFRC, college staff, and students at large.
- Conducts all official correspondence for the student government.
- Keeps track of student attendance at meetings to ensure voting eligibility.
- Picks up and distributes mail daily.
- Posts agendas, minutes and other necessary paperwork in accordance with Brown Act. (Posts agendas and minutes 72 hours prior to ASFRC meetings.)
- Takes all notes of meetings.
- Keeps records of receipts and disbursements.
- Is responsible for picking up and returning the cash boxes and cash for all major ASFRC sponsored events.
- Has a basic knowledge of bookkeeping procedures and practices.
- Is actively involved in representing the ASFRC on campus and in the community.

Student Trustee

- Attends all meetings of the College's Board of Trustees (except closed session meetings), and presents information regarding student activities/government to the Board, as appropriate.
- Represents student constituency to the Board and votes accordingly.
- Is actively involved in representing the ASFRC on campus and in the community.

Cal SACC Representative:

The ASFRC representative to the California Student Associate of Community College (Cal-SACC):

- Attends and represents the ASFRC at all Cal-SACC regional meetings.
- Reports issues from those meetings at the ASFRC meetings, and brings issues and concerns of FRC students to the regional board and its state-wide representatives.
- Is actively involved in representing the ASFRC on campus and in the community.
