**WorldWideWhiteboard** is a Canvas-based collaborative platform designed specifically for educators to enhance and simplify the learning experience, both for face-to-face and online classes. **NetTutor** is a user-friendly platform that connects students to great tutors. The goal of NetTutor is to provide each student with the opportunity to seek assistance and develop the skills necessary to move ahead successfully.

Join Kim Beaton and Jachin Reilley for a demonstration of how these tools can be used for live online office hours, live one-to-one/one-to-many online tutoring sessions, and how students can seek tutoring after hours. Additionally, learn about your access to an extensive array of teaching and learning tools, such as how students can receive asynchronous writing support through the paper center or using online study groups. WWWB works on any device including phones and mobile devices.

  - Demonstrate how to add WWWboard to their specific class
  - Understand and demonstrate the various functions of the interface options
  - Perform one-on-one tutoring sessions/office hours
  - Demonstrate improved comprehension of the NetTutor application
  - Develop strategies for supporting students' academic success

The presenter takes participants through the logic of aligning course student learning outcomes to assignments that lead efficiently and thoughtfully to authentic learning assessment. In watching this video, you will get some fresh ideas for creating both F2F and online assignments relevant to 21<sup>st</sup> century students. These ideas will undoubtedly reinvigorate your approach to course design and course SLOACs!

  - Develop a holistic assessment plan that includes a range of assessment types
