Birdhouse Building

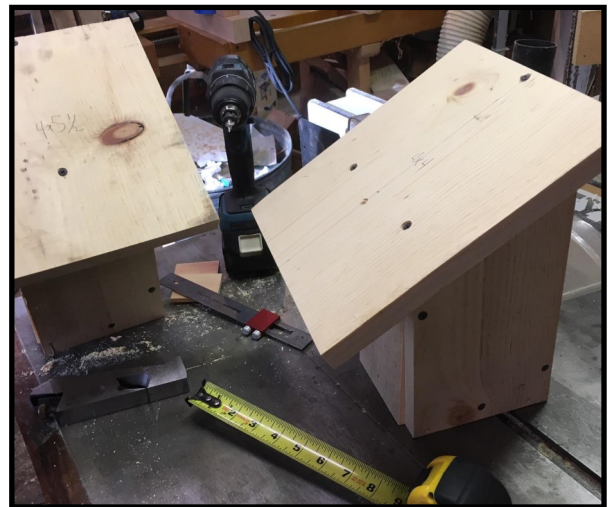

Participants will assist in a limited mass production of birdhouses that will be used by the US Forest Service, Audubon Society, and homeowners. The goal will be to make at least three different sizes for different species, and possibly some bat boxes. Each student is intended to leave the class with about 5 birdhouses if he/she agrees to promptly install them.

No prior wood working experience is required. Instructors will cover tool safety, construction technique, and work with students to build as many birdhouses as time will allow.
