### **COVID-19 Testing, Screening and Expectations for Students Returning to Campus**

*If you are experiencing COVID symptoms or have experienced symptoms within the last 14 days, DO NOT COME TO CAMPUS. Contact the Vice President of Student Services at 530-283-0202 ext. 273 to discuss other arrangements for testing. Contact your instructor if you need to miss class. The health and safety of our students, employees and community is a top priority.*

In partnership with Plumas District Hospital, rapid testing is being provided at no cost to students who are enrolled in classes that meet on campus. Testing will occur August 17<sup>th</sup> - August 21<sup>st</sup>, and August 24<sup>th</sup> from 8-9:30 AM. Students are REQUIRED to schedule an appointment in order to be tested as specific information must be provided to the lab 24 hours prior. Students who show up and do not have an appointment will NOT be tested.

#### **Authorization for Release of COVID-19 Records**

All students will need to fill out a release authorizing PDH to inform FRC of the test results. Release forms will be available when students arrive for testing, or students may print the form and bring it with them.

#### **Students Living in FRC Student Housing**

Student residents have already been scheduled based on their move-in date and do NOT need to sign up, however they must show up on their scheduled day and time as capacity is limited. Contact Student Housing at 530-283-0202 ext. 414 if you have questions. Students who test positive will not be allowed to move-in to student housing until they are cleared by Public Health. Please plan accordingly.

#### **Test Results**

Results will be available the same day, we anticipate between 3-4 PM. While waiting for test results, students will be routed to the football field to participate in outdoor, small group, socially distanced orientations. Students who live off-campus and do not need to attend orientation may go home after testing. They will only be notified of their result if it is positive.

#### **Orientation**

All students will participate in Healthy Campus, Healthy Community Orientation to learn expectations for behavior on campus and in the community in relation to COVID-19.

Other orientation sessions include: New Student Orientation, Athletic Orientation, Student Housing Orientation and Agriculture and Equine Orientation (Ag/Equine available M-W only). Students will be able to attend all sessions that pertain to them. In addition, stations will be set up for students to meet staff from student services, get their student ID photo taken, apply for CalFresh, fill out a parking permit application, and there will be some fun (yet safe) activities, too! All students will receive a healthy swag bag with a face covering, thermometer, hand sanitizer and water bottle. Lunch will also be provided. Every minute of the day may not be occupied so we encourage you to bring a book, etc. Parents are welcome to attend.

**Self-Monitoring**

In addition to testing, students are strongly encouraged to self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days prior to their test. The Symptoms Monitoring Worksheet is attached.

In addition, the College is implementing a daily COVID-19 symptom assessment called SAFER Play. Students will receive a daily email to their FRC student email address to complete the assessment. If a student is “flagged” they will be referred to a healthcare provider for additional screening and instructions. FRC has contracts in place with Plumas County Public Health Agency and Plumas District Hospital.

**Face Coverings**

FRC requires all people, including students, faculty, staff, and visitors to wear a face covering that covers their mouth and nose at all times while on campus and indoors and in outdoor situations where six feet of social distancing from others is not possible. Failure to comply is interpreted as a threat to the health and safety of others and will be subject to disciplinary action as a violation of FRC’s Student Code of Conduct. Students are responsible for providing and washing their own face covering. Vented face masks with valves are not permitted as a face covering. Individuals who have health or medical reasons for not wearing face coverings should work with the Disability Support Program for Students (DSPS) to establish accommodations to address the health concern.
