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### **Accessibility Discussion – 9:00 – 9:30 am**

Session Hosts: 'ADA Title II Compliance Team' on campus, which includes representatives from: IT, Communications, DSPS, and Instruction.

Hear from our campus working group on the upcoming ADA Title II regulations that will impact FRC this spring, including upcoming deadlines and what action we all have to take collectively. DSPS will review how to make documents more accessible, including PDF's, excel sheets, and PowerPoint presentations. Communications will discuss web content, videos, and social media. IT will discuss other ways this impacts campus, including campus emails. The session will then segue into Canvas specific content in the next session, led by Instruction.

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### **Canvas Training – 9:30 – 10:30 am**

In this workshop, faculty will learn how to create accessible pages in Canvas that meet WCAG 2.1 and federal accessibility requirements. Participants will explore built-in Canvas tools such as the Accessibility Checker and Pope Tech Connect, along with AI-assistance to improve Canvas usability for all students. Whether teaching fully online or using Canvas to support in-person courses, attendees will leave with a better understanding of how to create content that is inclusive, compliant, and student-centered."

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## **AI in Higher Education – 10:30-12:00 pm**

Join Don Harjo Daves-Rougeaux, Senior Advisor to the California Community College Chancellor for a thoughtful and equity-minded approach to the increasing use of artificial intelligence in higher education, and specifically within the California Community Colleges. In his current role, Daves-Rougeaux focuses on aligning workforce development with the system's Vision 2030 and integrating innovative technology, including AI, across the community college system. Participants will examine both the opportunities and challenges of AI, including classroom impacts, rural access and digital inequities, environmental considerations, and data privacy while beginning the foundational work of developing institutional guidelines and policies. The session will cover some practical tools, real-time examples from other colleges, and a guided discussion to support responsible, transparent, and student-centered implementation.

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

- Identify key considerations and risks related to AI use in teaching, learning, and support services.
- Articulate core principles and guiding questions to inform institutional AI policy and practices.
- Explore practical, responsible use cases and examples of AI adoption at other California Community Colleges.
- Increase personal and campus-wide AI literacy to support transparent, ethical, and accountable implementation.
