



## **Weeks Marine Full-Tuition Scholarship Program for Maritime Technology**

Each year, subject to availability of funds, one full-tuition scholarship will be awarded to a graduating high school senior or graduating WorkReady U – Adult Education student from Northshore Technical Community College's five parish service area (St. Tammany, Washington, St. Helena, Tangipahoa and Livingston) enrolling full-time in the Maritime Technology program. The scholarship is for full tuition, for two consecutive semesters, for a maximum total scholarship award of \$5,000 (fall and spring semesters only).

## **SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

The Weeks Marine scholarship fund provides scholarships to assist graduating high school and Work Ready U – Adult Education students who will enroll full time in NTCC's Maritime Technology program. The recipient is selected by Northshore Technical Community College's Scholarship Selection Committee. Additionally, students who apply for the scholarship must meet the following criteria\*:

- Completed FAFSA on file at time of application, with Northshore Technical Community College's School Code: 006756
- Must be a resident of Louisiana and a graduating high school senior or Work Ready U –
  Adult Education student from NTCC's five parish service area (St. Tammany,
  Washington, St. Helena, Tangipahoa and Livingston)
- Must enroll in Fall 2020 and declare a major in the Maritime Technology program at Northshore Technical Community College
- Students must have successfully completed 12 hours of coursework during the first semester to continue receiving the scholarship
- Students must be registered as a full-time student during both (fall and spring) semesters
- Students must maintain a grade point average of at least a 2.0 to continue receiving the scholarship

<sup>\*</sup>At the end of each semester, Northshore Technical Community College will verify the student's progress in the program to determine whether the student is eligible to reapply for scholarship the following semester. Upon graduation, Northshore Technical Community College will request information from the scholarship recipient regarding certification testing outcomes and initial employment information.
