Following lunch, the committee adjourned to the automotive department at the Rayburn Correctional campus. Neal Harris welcomed the group and expressed his appreciation for their efforts to attend.

Old Business:

We reviewed minutes from fall 2021 meeting. Admission requirements, program content, program length, and program objectives were reviewed from the previous meeting.

New Business:

The committee reviewed the Equipment and Materials necessary for the success of the program. Delivery mode and student evaluations were also reviewed. All items were found to be satisfactory. Next we discussed and completed employer verification forms. Tool storage and tools for the program were also evaluated and found to be satisfactory. Roe commented that all tools and equipment appeared in good condition with safety guards in place.

Some of the group discussions included: more frequent use of diesel engines in passenger cars and light trucks to meet more stringent emission requirements. Ford has a new 2.0L diesel engine for the transit, and the transit connect. No word on if it is going to be used in more passenger car applications or mainly commercial vehicles. The current Push for electric vehicles and some of the models were also a main focus of conversation, as well as high fuel prices and the possible cause of it.
