# Electrician Program Occupational Advisory Committee Minutes December 13, 2021 @ 11:00 am

Members Present: Robert Pate, Kelly Engel (Dixieland Forest Corp. Electrical Contractor)

Guest: Mary Slazer, NTCC Director of Institutional Advancement Services

The Electrician Fall 2021 Advisory Committee meeting was held at the Lacombe Campus. Robert Pate called the meeting to order at 11:00 am.

Pate welcomed Kelly Engel to the committee and explained that the Electrician Program at the Lacombe Campus is relatively new, and its start was somewhat interrupted by the COVID pandemic in 2020 when students were required to attend virtually. The advisory committee serves to inform the program of needs and developments in the region and to forge partnerships for training. Engel stated that he's a project manager at Dixieland. They currently employ 40 electricians but need more.

Pate reviewed the minutes of the June 10, 2021, meeting. He noted the program is working with the committee on contractor-hosted training. The value of contractor-hosted training is the company's ability to observe and evaluate the trainees, increasing the ability to hire qualified employees. NTCC is available to do in-house training for local companies, for example if a training is needed for specialization such as hospital wiring.

Business and Industry Update – Engel described Dixieland's services as 50/50 commercial and residential, with some light industrial. The residential work is primarily custom homes rather than tract housing. He added that business is brisk and they currently have more work than they can do.

Curriculum Review – Pate demonstrated the NTCC website including the admissions process, Electrician program content and length of program. Pate is the advisor for students in the program at the Lacombe Campus. The program generally takes 4 semesters to complete, although some students are able to earn the Technical Diploma in 3 semesters. Pate encourages students to work in the field while attending school to gain invaluable "real world" experience. He works with employers to schedule classes for those students one day per week and their labs are completed through their work in the field. Regarding delivery mode, some classes are offered online but most need to be hands on. NCCER training is offered through Pearson and all testing is online. The lab is equipped with all of the tools and apparatus that students will encounter as top-level apprentices.

Program Review – Pate explained that each NTCC program has learning objectives and program assessment is based on those objectives. Students also do evaluations which are very useful for adjusting and improving teaching methods. The Program Health Index Results discussion was tabled until the next meeting.

The Electrical Technology program held its Spring 2022 semi-annual Advisory Committee meeting on May 5, 2022 at 9:30 AM. Robert Pate welcomed the group and expressed his appreciation for their support and called the meeting to order
