Check



You should look at your student's Chromebook and see what they are doing. Tell your child that you are doing this to ensure they are making good choices. Remember, this is not their diary; it is a learning tool issued to them by the school. It's not much different than reviewing a homework assignment.

Ask



The key here is listening. Ask questions to have an open, honest dialogue with your child. You want your child to come to you if they are feeling pressured, bullied, stressed, or confused. Show them you have a genuine interest in what they are learning and doing and want to help them.

Restrict



This is a device that really can help with schoolwork and learning, but that doesn't mean that students need to sleep with it. Set limits in your home with your devices such as when to put them down, what your child may visit online, and where the student uses the Chromebook. Monitoring your child's online usage will help them responsible use.

Encourage



Encourage your child to be a smart digital citizen. Discuss with your child positive ways to use the Chromebook to enhance learning and access to learning tools. Encourage them to think about what other's feelings might be when interacting with their classmates in an online environment. Encourage them to represent themselves well on the internet.
