1. LSC Chair Peggy Herrington called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Roll call was taken and a quorum established.
2. Approval of Agenda: Anna Proni moved to approve the agenda for the LSC meeting. Monte Luzadder seconded the motion. Approved unanimously.
3. Approval of Minutes from the 01-18-18 meeting: Peggy Herrington moved to approve the minutes and Mary Lubben seconded the motion. Approved unanimously.
4. Public Participation: Sarah Makela presented monthly GROWCommunity update:  
An Evening with Amundsen and Lake View High Schools will take place on Wednesday, April 4 from 6:30-8:30pm at Coonley Elementary School. An Ice Cream Social will take place the following week on 04-10-18 at Lake View for incoming freshman.
5. New Business:
  - a. Approval of Internal Accounts: LSC members received copies of the Internal Accounting Cash Disbursements Journal, Cash Receipts Journal and Balance Sheet. Peggy Herrington moved to approve the internal accounts and Anna Proni seconded the motion. Approved unanimously.

**6. Reports:**

**a. Chair:** Peggy Herrington reminded everyone that the next LSC elections will be held Thursday, April 19, 2018 for high schools. Those planning to run again need to have forms turned in by 03-05-18. There will be a candidate forum on 03-21-18 at 6:00pm in the Wildcat Room. Those elected will begin their terms on 07-01-18. The April LSC meeting date was changed from the 19<sup>th</sup> (No School-report card day) to the 12<sup>th</sup>. A 04-26-18 special LSC meeting date was set for 04-26-18 to discuss the election results. Peggy Herrington attended the Instructional Core Meeting and visited various classrooms in the school with Principal Karafiol.

**b. Principal:** LSC members received copy of Principal's Report slide show presentation featuring Winning Wildcats, Construction Updates Professional Learning Teams, Culture & Climate, Safety Measures at LVHS, Curriculum & Assessment, Programming Timeline, STEM Teaching & Learning, Family, Community, University & Corporate Partnerships and CIWP Process.:

**Winning Wildcats:** Boys Basketball won senior night game against Holy Cross. Frosh/Soph Wrestling took 5<sup>th</sup> place in City. Shanoor Khan and Anthony Cave advanced to sectionals. Girls Basketball advanced to IHSA Sectionals.

**Construction Updates:** Exterior tuck-pointing continues and turf construction is set to begin on 03-26-18. Field design is being finalized. Color schemes for the bathrooms and library have been finalized.

**Professional Learning Teams:** addressed trauma, course planning and supporting students in advanced courses. Senior Leadership went on retreat on 02-15-18. Created schoolwide professional learning calendar for semester 2.

**Culture & Climate:** Administration led talking circles around school safety. Deans continued coaching teachers in improving classroom culture and routines. March Attendance Incentive – the advisory with the highest attendance will get a breakfast sponsored by Mariano's.

**Safety Measures:** Students present IDs which are scanned at entry and re-entry. Visitors will present IDs to enter school. Security, Admins and CPD will monitor dismissal. There will be whole-school drills for safety situations.

**Curriculum & Assessment:** Golden Ticket ceremony for 249 students nominated for AP/DC courses was held On 01-26-18. Planning for enhanced computer science pathways leading to an AS Web Development and industry certifications.

**Programming Timeline:** dateline provided for new programming system for Freshmen, Sophomores and Juniors. Students, parents and counselors all involved in the process. Programming will begin in late February and end in early May.

**Curriculum & Assessment:** higher rigor novels for English classes were identified and purchased. All unit plans will have increased integration of SFA. Teachers engaged in using SAT Skills Insight to define appropriately challenging objectives.

**STEM Teaching & Learning:** 96.5% of Freshmen were on-track at the end of semester 1 and 47.5 had GPAs of 3.0 or higher. SOT analyzed study practices data and found that 25% of sophomores didn't study for finals and 25% studied with a passive technique (e.g. reading the text).

**Family, Community, University & Corporate Partnerships:** LVHS hosted a partnership summit on 01-23-18 to create action plans through EOY. LVHS hosted the annual Blaine Tea Dance. LVHS met with GROWCommunity to plan the Cubs Foundation grant proposal.

**CIWP Process:** form CIWP committee, gather data according to SEF, share data and identify areas of growth, determine next steps (including further data collection) and execute and evaluate. Staff will attend a one day retreat on 03-07-18. Committee looking for one parent rep, one community rep and one teacher rep. Mary Lubben and Phil English volunteered and will attend the approximate three to four upcoming committee meetings.

**c. Student Rep:** Anesa Saric presented her report. She and Principal Karafiol conducted an Open Circle to discuss safety concerns in the school. Students did not report any recent fights or violence but expressed their concerns about the crowded hallways during passing periods and problems that surround that. Students also complained about the "gross" conditions of the bathrooms in the school. Anesa asked her fellow LSC members if there was anything she could do more in her role as student rep. All LSC members agreed that Anesa is doing a great job at representing the student body and her insight is greatly appreciated to those of us that are not in the school on a daily basis.

**e. Community Relations:** Sarah Makela from GROWCommunity gave her report earlier in the meeting.
