APS COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY EXAMPLES OF GIVING BACK

Auburn High School:

- The Lit Club is currently collecting, sorting, and will eventually be wrapping books to be distributed to kids in the after school program at AYFS for the holidays.
- The AHS Athletic Leadership Council volunteered at the Auburn Rocket Race 5k that benefits Auburn Youth and Family Services. They have set up water tables along the course and handed out water to the participants.
- Life Skills Students work in the Food Pantry @ AYFS.
- Life Skills Interns volunteer for Special Olympics and Unified Sports.

- The softball team is involved in the community in many ways. Last Spring they visited the elderly home in Auburn to have dinner and play games. Every year the teams (both baseball and softball) run youth clinics that reach out to children of all ages in the town.
- Art students have volunteered for face painting at events like the Klepto 5k and the Duck Race, as well as submitting to numerous shows and helping with exhibits such as the district show. They are also involved with the Cultural Council's yearly art show. One art student is currently volunteering at AYFS teaching art classes.
- Basketball teams volunteer at the Special Olympics.
- Television production classes filmed and edited World Cafe video.
- Continue to film the Senate forum once a month.
- Class of 2018 officers collected canned food on Halloween night instead of trick or treating and donated it to AYFS. \$560 in t-shirt sales were donated by the Class of 2018 in memory of Ron Tarentino.
- The Boys and Girls Track and Field teams hold an annual "Tracksgiving" celebration in February, where they celebrate the track season, but also hold a canned food drive. The proceeds are donated to AYFS. This event is attended by approximately 150 people; athletes and their families, so the can drive has yielded great results over the past couple of years.
- International Club hosts a booth at Homecoming that is available to the greater Auburn community and also organizes the International Luncheon for the PD Day in March.
 This serves the APS community. Additionally, the International Festival, held in April, is an event that encourages cultural awareness among the AHS community.
- Chorus & Band Students, many participate in the Greater Auburn Community Chorus, Church Choir(s), Worcester Youth Symphony Orchestra, CCD assistants/teachers and Relay for Life.

- Baseball team runs numerous free and paid clinics for the youth in the community. They
 are in the 12th year of offering a free community clinic. They also work on town fields,
 Lemansky, Bryn Mawr and Franklin for the DPW and Little League. They also donate a
 lot of gear and clinic tuition vouchers to many fundraising raffles.

- Girls' basketball teams puts on at least one clinic a year to work on skills with the youth in town.
