# About Northwest Louisiana Technical Community College (NLTCC)

In 2019 NLTCC became a comprehensive community and technical college through legislative action of the Louisiana Legislature. The legislation renamed the former Northwest Louisiana Technical College as Northwest Louisiana Technical Community College and provided for an expansion of its mission and educational programs. NLTCC has four campuses with the main campus in Minden and additional campuses in Camp Minden, Mansfield, and Shreveport.

## **Academic and Workforce Development Programs**

NLTCC takes pride in its academic programs and offers comprehensive student experiences by prioritizing the needs of its students and community. NLTCC offers more than 20 high value programs across credit, non-credit, dual enrollment, and WorkReady U, an adult basic education program. Students can earn the associate of applied science degree, technical diploma, certificate of technical studies, and HighSet (high school equivalency).

Through timely and relevant training, NLTCC develops a skilled workforce that provides the competitive advantage needed by existing and new businesses in Northwest Louisiana. NLTCC recognizes the critical training and educational needs of individuals and businesses and works to accommodate industry's educational and training needs.

# Community

With its distinctive, red-bricked Main Street lined with shops, banks, and churches, old-time charm pervades downtown Minden. Minden is also a gateway to outdoor recreation galore at destinations like Dorcheat Bayou and Lake Bistineau, teeming with largemouth bass and the Caney Lakes Recreation Area with its numerous trails, campsites, and lakes. The Webster Parish Fair comes to Minden in October with rides, games, and a parade through downtown, while the Moess Art Center and City Farm combines art and agriculture and hosts annual events like the Spring Arts Festival.

# **Reporting Relationships**

The Chancellor of the college reports to the Louisiana Community and Technical College System President, who reports to the Louisiana Community and Technical College System Board of Supervisors. The Board is a 17-member body with 15 members appointed by the Governor of the state of Louisiana with consent of the Senate. The additional 2 members are student members elected by and from membership of a council composed of student body presidents.

- Demonstrated ability to work with business, industry, government, and the community at large.

#### Salary

Salary, benefits, lengths of contract, and other terms and conditions of employment are negotiable and competitive.
