Welcome to Epping Elementary School!


Ms. Stanley-Berting (Ms. S.B.) and Mrs. McDonough are the two school counselors at EES.

experience.







 - Staff referring students will contact families, school counselors will follow up with a permission form
 - Parents
 - Self-referral
- ★ All sessions are confidential except when a child is being hurt, hurting someone else, or threatens to hurt themselves. As mandated reporters, we will intervene to ensure a child's safety.
