




Latin Honors

Graduation Honors Speaker 2022



Eligibility:

Any graduating senior who meets the criteria for Summa Cum Laude (4.0 GPA) at the end of the first semester of senior year is eligible to apply. Classes completed during the second semester do not count toward this GPA requirement.

Student Process:

At the conclusion of the first semester, students meeting the eligibility criteria will receive a document outlining the speech contest rules and timeline for submission. Students will also receive the rubric that the committee will use to score speeches.

Student Process:


Students will submit a digital copy of their speech to the school counselor by the given deadline. The school counselor will remove any identifying information contained in the speech so that speeches can be judged blindly.

Student Process:

Student speeches will be reviewed by the faculty selection committee. Using the rubric and scoring guidelines the top candidate will be selected.




Graduation Honors Speaker 2022



Student Process:

All students who submitted a speech will be notified of their status once a speech is selected by the committee. The selected student will have the opportunity to make minor adjustments to their speech prior to graduation.



Graduation Honors Speaker 2022



Committee Process:

- 1. A faculty committee consisting of 1 administrator and 4 teachers will be selected by the building principal.**
- 2. The committee will meet together to review the speeches and independently score each speech on a rubric.**
- 3. Scores will be tallied and the speech with the highest score will be selected as the winner. In case of a tie, the tied speeches will be voted on by the committee.**
- 4. All speeches and scoring rubrics will be saved until after graduation in case an unforeseen circumstance requires the second place speech to be selected.**

Graduation Honors Speaker 2022



Graduation:

- 1. The student selected to give their speech at graduation will be referred to as the Honors Speaker and the speech will be referred to as the Honors Address.**
- 2. During the ceremony, the Honors Address will take place after the Superintendent's Remarks and before the guest speaker.**





Student Survey Info:


On a scale of 1-4 what is your stress level for C-Days?

Every assignment is due Monday, so the entire weekend is spent studying. A day teachers assign tons of homework due the next day on C days.


