Though Dr. King paid a steap price for working for equality, his contributions would offer a gleem of hope that change would come.

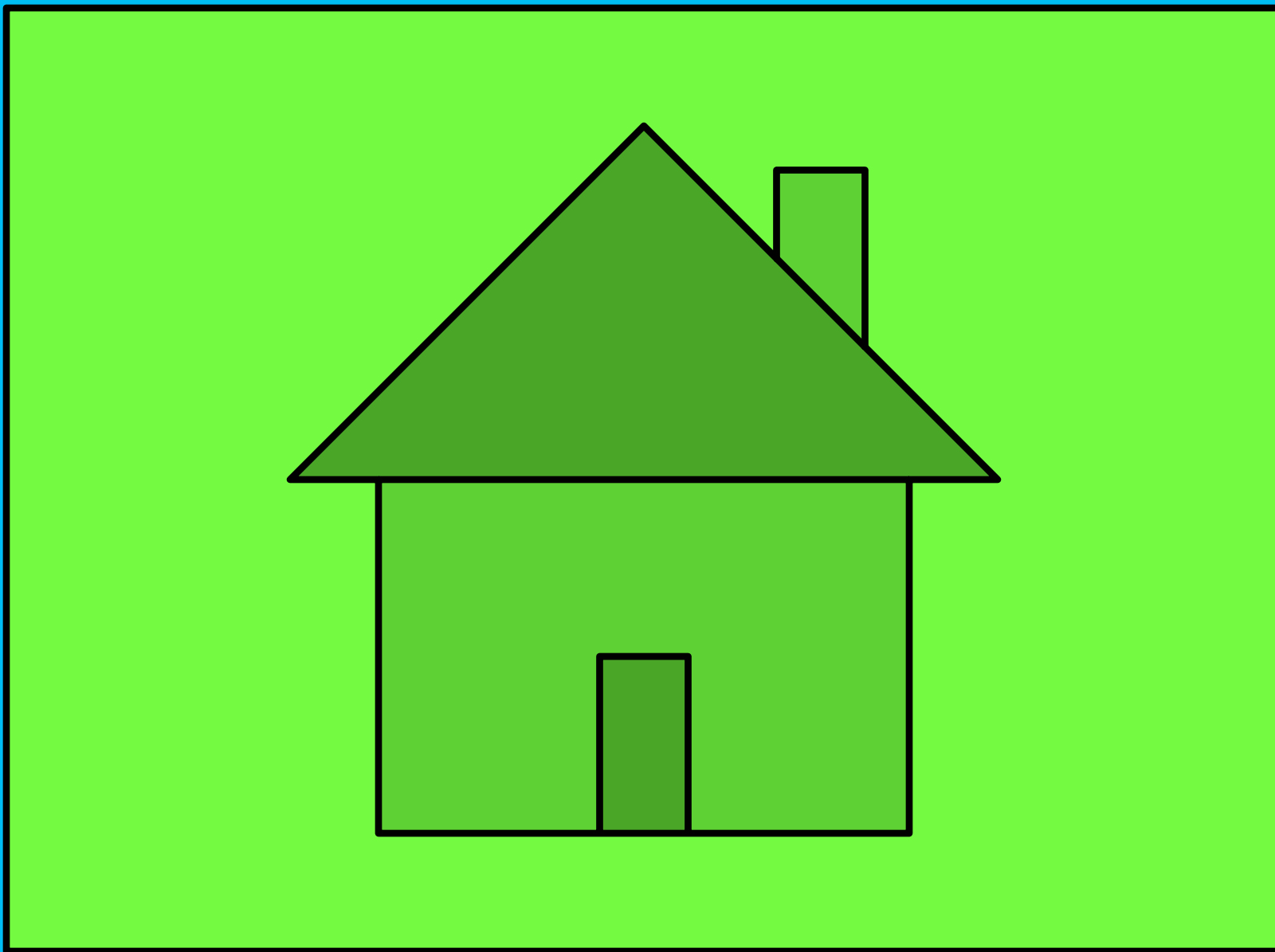
