PROFILE: 2018-2019

Stoneham, a middle to upper-middle income suburban community of about 23,000 people located 10 miles north of Boston, is composed primarily of business, professional and semi-professional residents. Stoneham High School is a comprehensive, four-year public high school with an enrollment of approximately 672 students and accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Its 68 member faculty has earned 3 Ph.D's and 64 Master's Degrees and brings an average of 13 years' experience to the classroom. As members of the Middlesex League, Stoneham High School student-athletes compete in over 20 varsity sports.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Stoneham High School operates on a 7 day, 6 period schedule. Full year courses earn 5 credits. Half-year or semester courses earn 2.5 credits. Students must earn a minimum of 115 credits and fulfill the following course requirements to graduate:

- AP.....Advanced Placement
- HONORS.....Honors college preparatory program
- INTENSIVE.....A demanding college preparatory curriculum
- COMPREHENSIVE.....College preparatory program presented at a slower pace in a highly structured program
- UNLEVELED.....Courses do not require levels
- TRANSITIONAL.....Courses designed to prepare for the Comprehensive level
