1971 - Soccer, Hockey, Tennis



Mike Geragosian was an outstanding student-athlete at Stoneham High School from 1967-1971. He excelled in three varsity sports for the Spartans: soccer, tennis, and ice hockey. He was captain of the varsity soccer team his senior year, lettered in varsity tennis for four years, and was selected Booster Club best student athlete his senior year.

Although he was an outstanding student-athlete in soccer and tennis, ice hockey was Mike's true passion. His work ethic and love for the game allowed Mike to shine on and off the ice, leading to some truly unheralded credentials. As a freshman in 1967, Mike earned the starting goalie role for the Spartans under Hall Of Fame coach Dick Burns. Mike's historic four year varsity record as goalie at SHS led his teams to an impressive 42 wins, ten losses and seven ties, with an impressive goals against average of 1.80. He is a member of the 1969-1970 Middlesex League championship Hall of Fame team and was elected to the 1971 Middlesex League Hockey All Star team.

Upon graduating from Stoneham High School in 1971, Mike went on to attend Lowell Technological Institute/Univ.of Lowell where once again he earned the job as the starting goaltender and held that position for all four years. Mike was elected to the All New England Hockey All Star team. During his tenure, he was also a finalist in the prestigious "Lester Cushing Award" as the best athlete of the year. He was elected to University of Lowell Hall of Fame in 1981.

Mike is a retired Marketing Education educator who spent thirty years teaching at Wakefield High School and Nashoba Technical in Westford, Mass. Mike used his coaching experience and his Stoneham roots to inspire many students to reach their goals and encouraged a successful identity to all those he taught.

Mike has held coaching positions at University of Lowell, where he assisted Coach Bill Riley to win three Division Two National Championships; helped coach Princeton University under Toot Cahoon; and was an assistant coach at Merrimack College under Ron Anderson. Mike also worked in USA Olympic hockey development programs for men's and women's ice hockey. He is presently coaching in his fifteenth year at Boston University where he helped coach a 2009 National Championship team under legendary Coach Jack Parker. Mike holds a Master's degree in Economics and currently resides in North Andover with his wife Diane. Together they have four children Adam, Brian, Craig, and Leah and one grandson Rylan.
