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COVID 19 Statements to Colleges:

GPA 2019-2020 calculated using 1st semester grades only.

Final grades were calculated using all 4 quarters.

Stoneham HS offered families two options upon returning to school for the 20-21 academic year, either returning for a hybrid model or going fully remote. Students choosing the hybrid model (which is the vast majority of our students) attend school every other day for synchronous instruction. On their remote days, instruction is asynchronous. Those students who have chosen the fully remote model are being educated through TECCA, a MA DESE approved online school. SHS will post grades on our transcript for fully remote students after the first semester, instead of first quarter. Remote classes will be indicated with "REM " after the name of the class on the transcript.

PROFILE: 2020-2021

Stoneham, a middle to upper-middle income suburban community of about 23,000 people located 10 miles north of Boston, is composed primarily of business, professional and semi-professional residents. Stoneham High School is a comprehensive, four-year public high school with an enrollment of approximately 615 students and accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. The vast majority of its 72 member teaching faculty hold advanced degrees of a master's degree or higher. As members of the Middlesex League, Stoneham High School student-athletes compete in over 20 varsity sports.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Stoneham High School operates on an 8 day, 5 period schedule. Full year courses earn 5 credits. Half-year or semester courses earn 2.5 credits. Students must earn a minimum of 115 credits and fulfill the following course requirements to graduate:
