Starting the Conversation: College and Your Mental Health Webinar

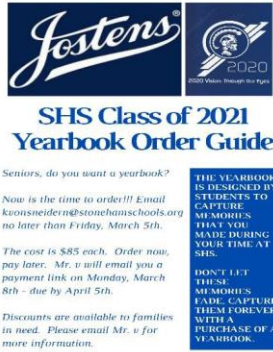

Free Breakfast and Lunch:
