This year's Council was unique in several respects: it was the largest and the last Council in the old high school, and the problem of holding two separate elections was first presented in the spring.

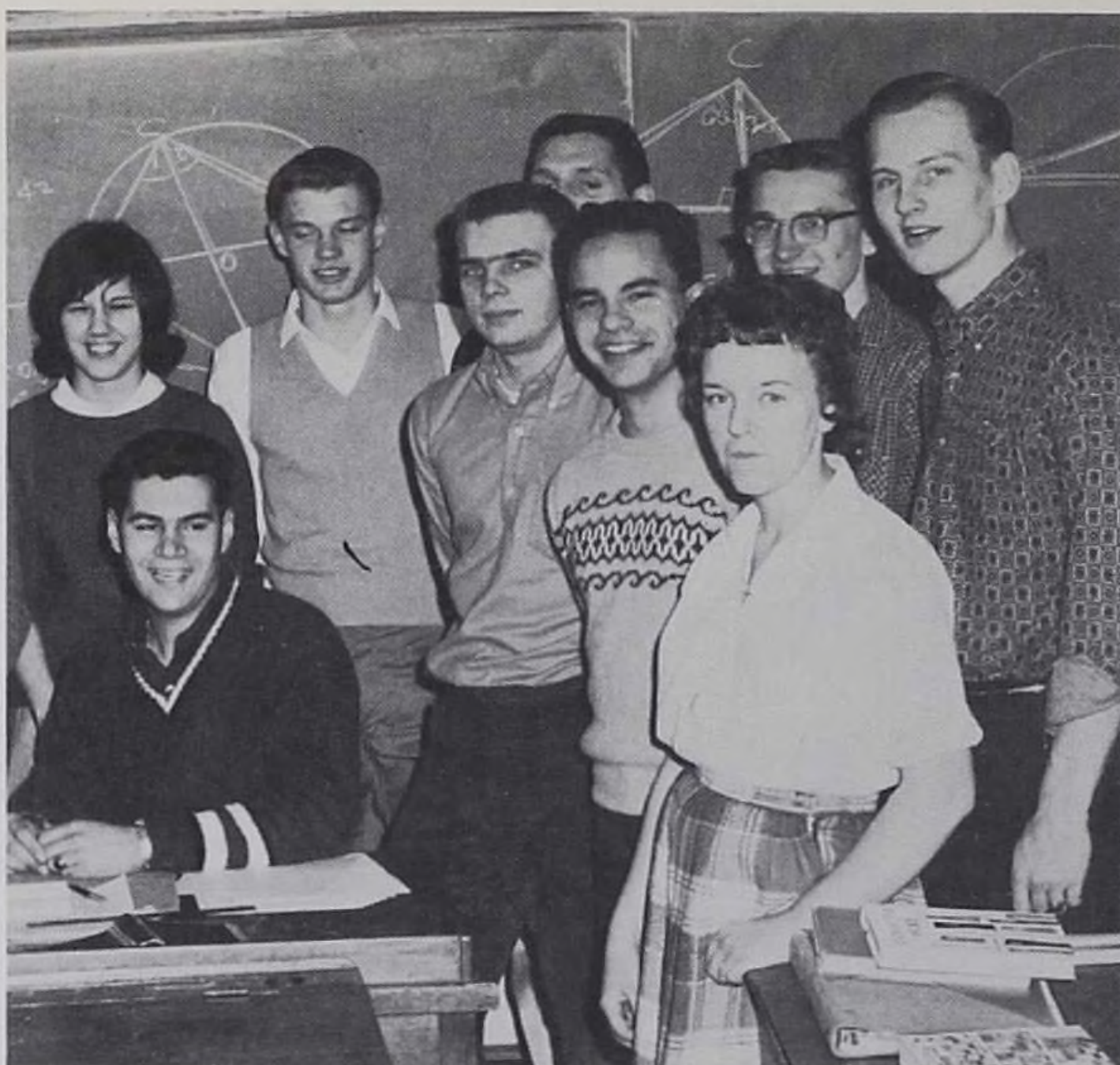
The Student Council this year, as always, provided its members with a fine training in leadership, responsibility, and representative form of government.

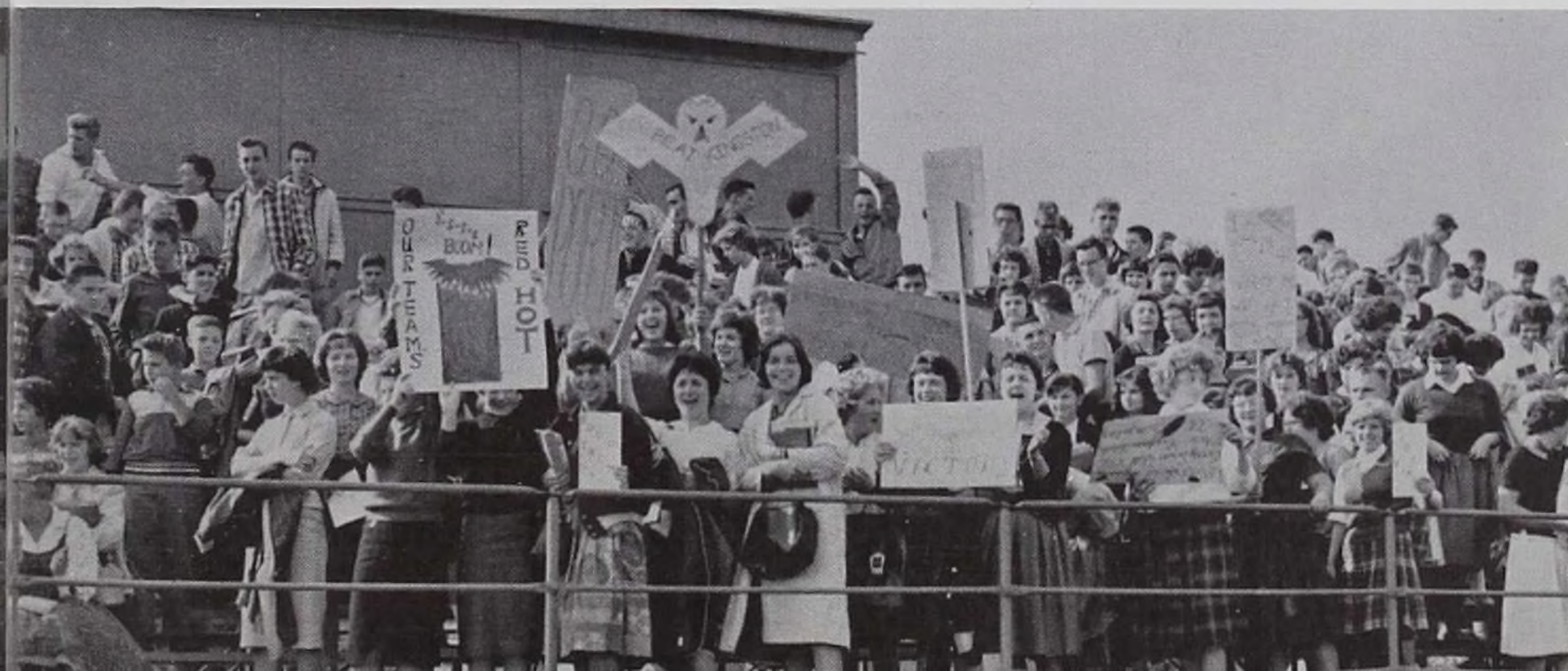

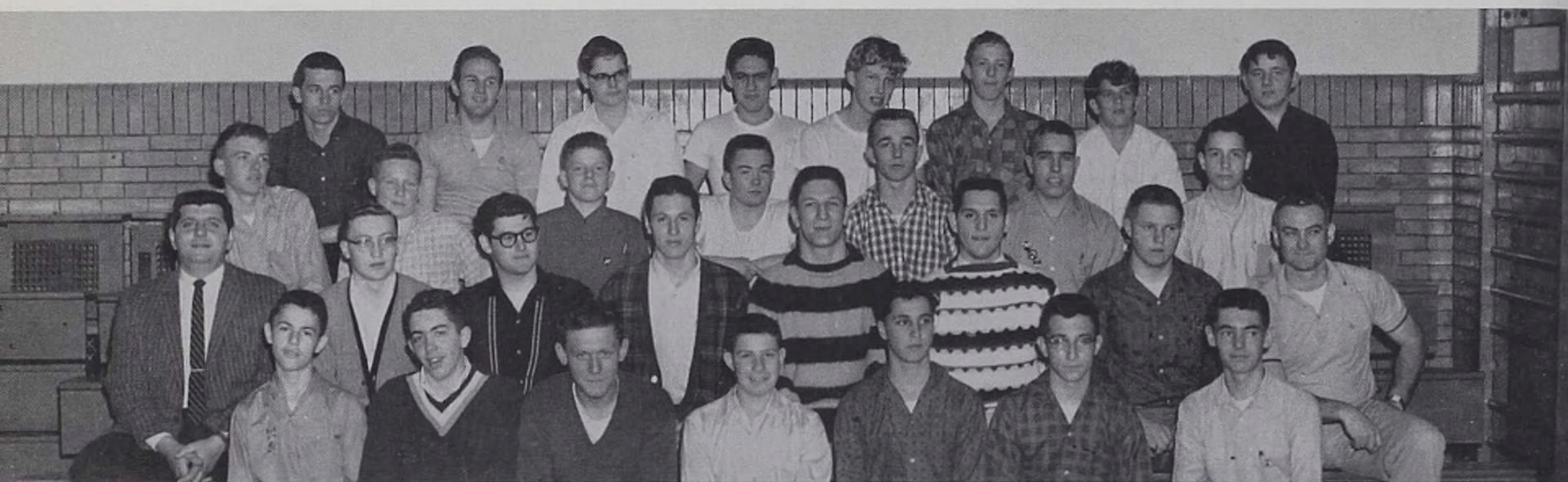
LATIN CLUB

VARSITY FOOTBALL

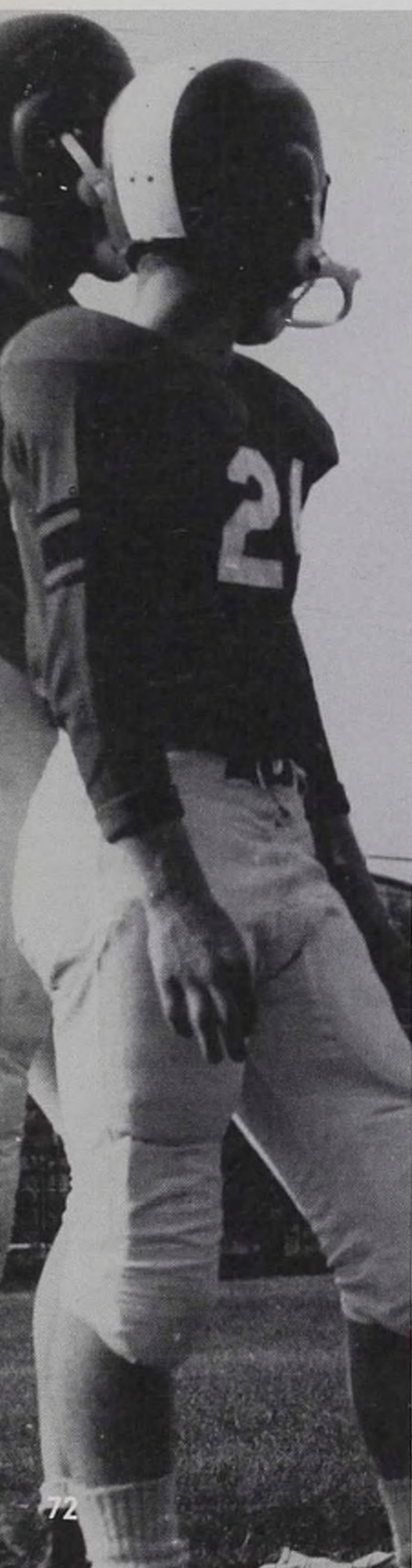

This year our track team has shown the ability to be one of the most successful in recent years at Port. The reason for this is because of the return of almost all of last year's athletes and many new members who have joined this year.

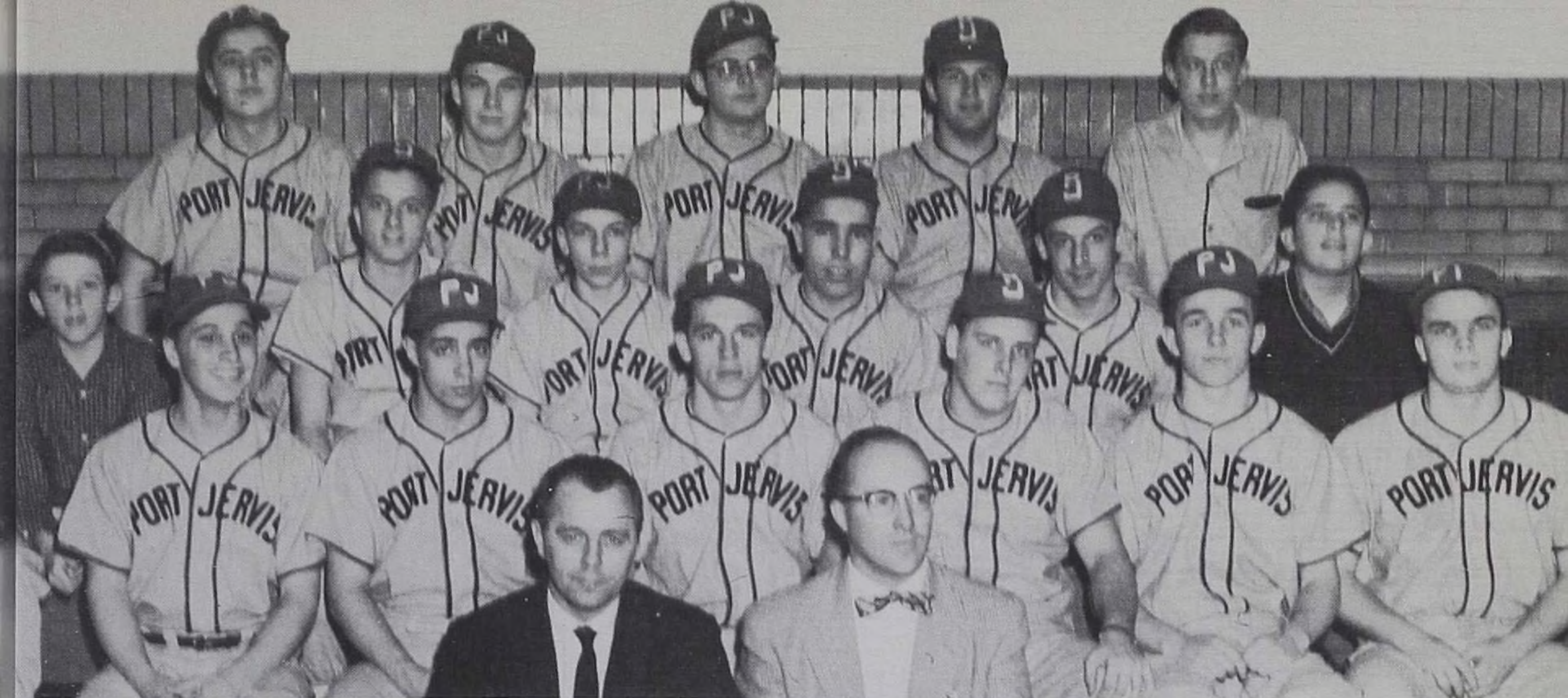

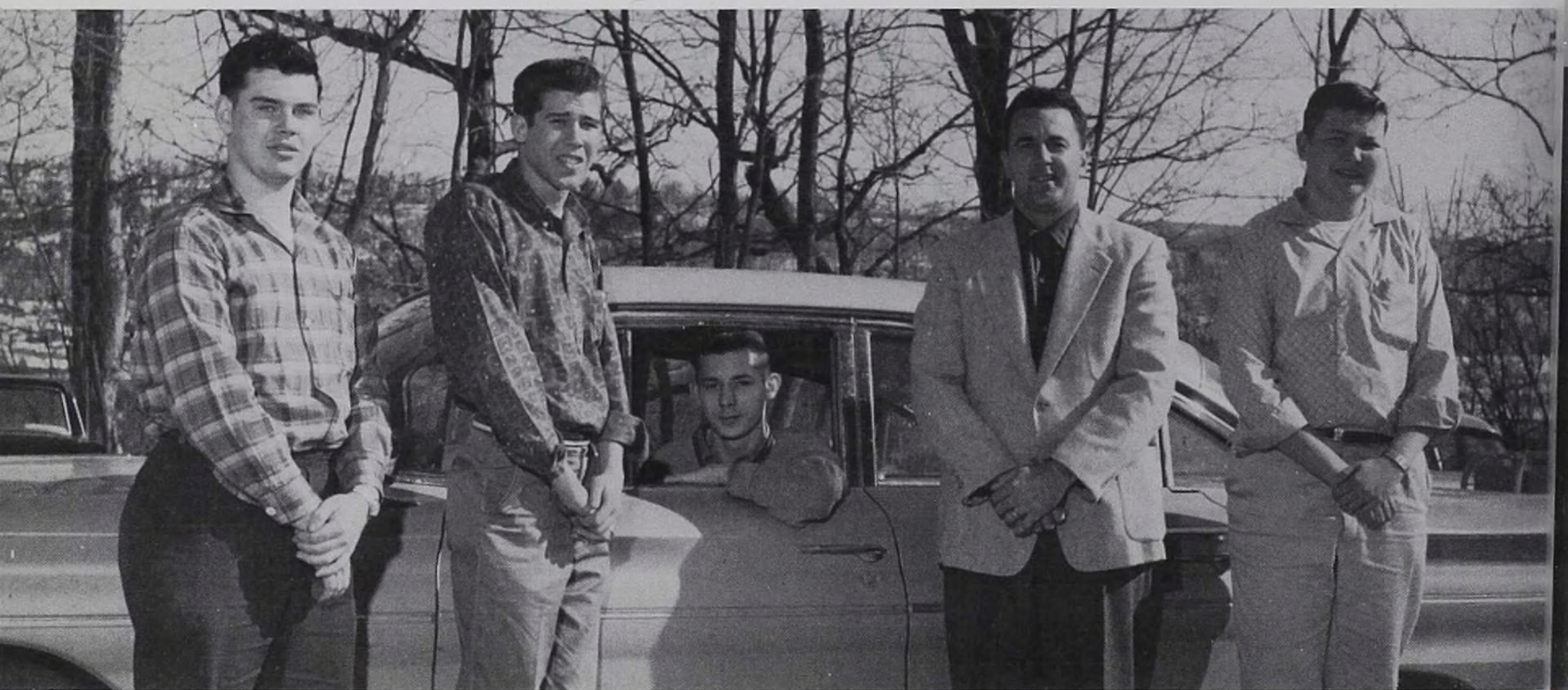
