

Ice Cube Paint

Use an old ice cube tray. One you no longer use for making ice cubes. If you don't have one, use very small paper cups, 3 oz size. Or bigger, but don't fill. Fill the tray (or cups) with water and add food coloring. Make sure to use enough to make a

Let the water freeze.

dark color.

Once frozen, let the "cubes" roll

around on a piece of paper in a box. As the ice melts, it will leave trails of watercolor on the paper. Use a straw to blow the cubes around as they get smaller.

You can use diluted tempera paint or Kool Aid in place of food coloring.

You can put popsicle sticks or toothpicks in the water before you freeze and then use them like paintbrushes.
