

# Flu Shot Clinic

It is time to think about getting out flu vaccines again this year. Influenza is a highly contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. The virus spreads easily from person to person via airborne droplets when someone sneezes or coughs, or when an object is touched that has been exposed to the virus. Influenza can lead to pneumonia, dehydration, and in severe cases, death. It can lead to worsening of chronic diseases, especially those with lung or heart disease. There is a strong possibility of missing school or work for 1 to 2 weeks.

It is strongly encouraged that the students and staff of HTRS receive a flu vaccine. It is more important this year than ever due to COVID. We are going to make it easy for that to happen. Pawnee County Rural Health Clinic will administer the vaccine to HTRS students and staff on **October 23, 2020**. They will be in the **Board Conference Room** between the hours of 7:30- 9:00 or until completed. **Please bring \$30** for a regular flu shot or **\$65** for the flublok or **high dose** shot. (for those 65 and older). You can also make checks payable to Pawnee County Rural Health Clinic (PCRHC) and the attached **permission slip**. If you have **insurance or Medicare**, please bring a copy of your insurance card as they will file the claim for you, even if you are not a patient of their medical practice. ***If your child receives Medicaid/Kid's Connection they are not eligible to receive the vaccine at school.***

Fill out the release for and return it to the school. **Payment and the release form must be with your child, or they will not receive the vaccine.** It is helpful to know if you plan to receive the flu shot on this day, so PRHC can be sure to bring enough doses. Parents of younger children, please feel free to accompany your child during the administration of the vaccine.

### INJECTABLE FLU IMMUNIZATION RELEASE

Flu immunizations will not protect all persons who get the flu. Flu immunizations will not protect against other illnesses that resemble the flu.

FOR PATIENTS (BOTH CHILDREN AND ADULTS) TO BE VACCINATED: The following questions will help us determine if there is any reason we should not give you or your child inactivated injectable influenza vaccination today. If you answer "yes" to any question, it does not necessarily mean you (or your child) should not be vaccinated. It just means additional questions must be asked. If a question is not clear, please ask your healthcare provider to explain it.
